Bills recommended by Study commissions	Tuesday, April 26	Tuesday, May 10
Bills directly and primarily affecting 2016-2017 Budget	Wednesday, April 27	Tuesday, May 10
Local Bills	Tuesday, May 3	Thursday, May 19
Bills primarily affecting State or local retirement systems	Tuesday, May 3	Thursday, May 19

Eligible to file in 2016 but no deadlines:

- (1) Bills amending the North Carolina Constitution.
- (2) Appointments to/confirmation of members of State Boards/commissions.
- (3) Resolutions not prohibited by House or Senate Rules.
- (4) Joint resolutions authorizing other bills and those bills if resolution passes by two-thirds vote in each chamber.
- (5) Election law bills.
- (6) Redistricting bills for House, Senate, and Congress.
- (7) Bills responding to litigation related to House, Senate and Congressional districts.
- (8) Bills responding to actions related to the Voting Rights Act of 1965.
- (9) Bills to disapprove Administrative Rules.
- (10) Adjournment resolution sine die.

Otherwise eligible for consideration

- (1) Bills that made cross-over.
- (2) Veto overrides.
