#### A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

2	AN ACT TO E	XTEND TO THIRTY-FIVE MILES THE CURRENT LIMITATION	
3	THAT PRO	HIBITS THE SITING OF A HAZARDOUS WASTE FACILITY,	
4	OPERATED	PURSUANT TO CHAPTER 130B OF THE GENERAL STATUTES,	
5	WITHIN T	WENTY-FIVE MILES OF A POLYCHLORINATED BIPHENYL	
6	LANDFILL FACILITY.		
7	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:		
8	Section 1. G.S. 130A-294(h) reads as rewritten:		
9	"(h) Rules adopted by the Commission shall be subject to the following requirements:		
10	(2)	Hazardous waste shall be treated prior to disposal in North Carolina.	
11		The Commission shall determine the extent of waste treatment	
12		required before hazardous waste can be disposed of in a hazardous	
13		waste disposal facility.	
14	(3)	Any hazardous waste disposal facility hereafter constructed in this	
15		State shall meet, at the minimum, the standards of construction	
16		imposed by federal regulations adopted under the RCRA at the time	
17		the permit is issued.	
18	(4)	No hazardous waste disposal facility or polychlorinated biphenyl	
19		disposal facility shall be located within 25 miles of any other	
20		hazardous waste disposal facility or polychlorinated biphenyl disposal	
21		facility.	
22	(5)	No hazardous waste facility operated pursuant to Chapter 130B of the	
23		General Statutes shall be located within 25-35 miles of a	
24		polychlorinated biphenyl landfill facility.

1	(6)	The following will not be disposed of in a hazardous waste disposal	
2		facility: ignitables as defined in the RCRA, polyhalogenated	
3		biphenyls of 50 ppm or greater concentration, and free liquids whether	
4		or not containerized.	
5	(7)	Facilities for disposal or long-term storage of hazardous waste shall	
6		have at a minimum the following: a leachate collection and removal	
7		system above an artificial impervious liner of at least 30 mils in	
8		thickness, a minimum of five feet of clay or clay-like liner with a	
9		maximum permeability of $1.0 \times 10^{-7}$ -centimeters per second (cm/sec)	
10		below said artificial liner, and a leachate detection system immediately	
11		below the clay or clay-like liner.	
12	(8)	Hazardous waste shall not be stored at a hazardous waste treatment	
13		facility for over 90 days prior to treatment or disposal.	
14	(9)	The Commission shall consider any hazardous waste treatment process	
15		proposed to it, if the process lessens treatment cost or improves	
16		treatment over then current methods or standards required by the	
17		Commission."	
18	Sec. 2	. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the North Carolina	
19	Hazardous Waste Management Commission the sum of \$10,000 for the 1990-91 fiscal		
20	year to be used for the Commission to revise its rules, procedures, and site selection		
21	process so that they are consistent with the provisions of Section 1 of this act.		
22	Sec. 3. Section 1 of this act is effective upon ratification and applies to any		
23	application for a new or draft license or permit pursuant to Chapter 130B of the General		
24	Statutes that is pending or that is filed on or after that date. Section 2 of this act shall		
25	become effective July 1, 1990.
