6	(b) The General Assembly finds that coastal-area counties have a special problem
7	with lack of maintenance of platted rights-of-way, resulting in ungraded sand
8	travelways deviating from the original rights-of-way and encroaching on private
9	property, and such cartways exhibit poor drainage and are blocked by junk automobiles.
10	(c) To address the problem described in subsection (b), the board of
11	commissioners of any coastal-area county as defined by G.S. 113A-103(2) may define
12	any number of service districts in order to finance, provide, or maintain for the districts
13	one or more of the following services, facilities and functions in addition to or to a
14	greater extent than those financed, provided or maintained for the entire county:
15	(1) Removal of junk automobiles; and
16	(2) Street maintenance."
17	Sec. 2. This act is effective upon ratification.
