2	AN ACT TO AUTHORIZE AND DIRECT THE ENVIRONMENTAL
3	MANAGEMENT COMMISSION TO PHASE IN STORMWATER RUNOFF
4	RULES AND PROGRAMS.
5	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
6	Section 1. G.S. 143-213 is amended by adding a new subdivision to read:
7	"(16a) 'Stormwater' means the flow of water which results from precipitation
8	and which occurs immediately following rainfall or a snowmelt."
9	Sec. 2. Article 21 of G.S. 143 is amended by adding a new section to read:
10	" <u>§ 143-214.7. Stormwater runoff rules and programs.</u>
11	(a) <u>Policy</u> , Purpose and Intent. The Commission shall undertake a continuing
12	planning process to develop and adopt a statewide plan with regard to establishing and
13	enforcing stormwater rules for the purpose of protecting the surface waters of the State.
14	It is the purpose and intent of this section that, in developing stormwater runoff rules
15	and programs, the Commission may utilize stormwater rules established by the
16	Commission to protect classified shellfish waters, water supply watersheds, and
17	outstanding resource waters; and to control stormwater runoff disposal in coastal
18	counties and other nonpoint sources. Further, it is the intent of this section that the
19	Commission phase in the stormwater rules on a priority basis for all sources of pollution
20	to the water. The plan shall be applied evenhandedly throughout the State to address the
21	State's water quality needs. The Commission shall continually monitor water quality in

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1	the State and shall revise stormwater runoff rules as necessary to protect water quality.
2	As necessary, the stormwater rules shall be modified to comply with federal regulations.
3	(b) The Commission shall be authorized and directed to implement stormwater
4	runoff rules and programs for point and nonpoint sources on a phased-in statewide
5	basis. The Commission shall consider standards and best management practices for the
6	protection of the State's water resources in the following order of priority:
7	(1) <u>Classified shellfish waters;</u>
8	(2) Water supply watersheds;
9	(3) Outstanding resource waters;
10	(4) <u>High quality waters; and</u>
11	(5) Other waters where the Commission finds control of stormwater is
12	needed to meet the purposes of this Article. Provided however, that
13	prior to implementation of rules under this subdivision 5, the
14	Commission shall consult with the Environmental Review
15	Commission.
16	(c) The Commission shall hold public hearings in accordance with Article 2 of
17	Chapter 150B. Prior to implementation of the rules, the Administrative Rules Review
18	Commission shall review the rule pursuant to G.S. 143B-30.2 to determine whether the
19	<u>rule:</u>
20	(1) Is within the authority delegated to the agency by the General
21	Assembly;
22	(2) Is clear and unambiguous;
23	(3) Is reasonably necessary to enable the administrative agency to perform
24	a function assigned to it by statute or to enable or facilitate the
25	implementation of a program or policy in aid of which the rule was
26	adopted."
27	• Sec. 3. The Commission shall report to the 1989 General Assembly on the
28	first day the Regular Session meets in 1990, provided that if the 1989 Regular Session
29	does not meet in 1990, the Commission shall report to the Environmental Review
30	Commission by October 1, 1989, concerning progress towards implementation of
31	stormwater runoff rules and programs.
32	Sec. 4. This act is effective upon ratification.
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
