A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
AN ACT AMENDING THE LAW CONCERNING THE DIVISION OF PUBLICATIONS WITHIN THE DEPARTMENT OF THE SECRETARY OF STATE. The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: Section 1. G.S. 143-47.7(b) reads as rewritten: "(b) The notice required by this Article shall state the name and office of the appointing authority, the public office to which the appointment is made, the name of the individual the appointee is replacing, the name and address of the appointee, a citation of the law pursuant to which the appointment is made, the date of the appointment, and the term of the appointment."
Sec. 2. G.S. 147-36 reads as rewritten:
"§ 147-36. Duties of Secretary of State. It is the duty of the Secretary of State: (1) To attend at every session of the legislature for the purpose of receiving bills which shall have become laws, and to perform such other duties as may then be devolved upon him by resolution of the
two Houses, or either of them; (2) To attend the Governor, whenever required by him, for the purpose of receiving documents which have passed the great seal; (2) To receive and been all conveyences and martages.
(3) To receive and keep all conveyances and mortgages

To distribute annually the statutes and the legislative journals;

belonging to the State;

1 (5) To distribute the acts of Congress received at his office in the manner 2 prescribed for the statutes of the State; 3 (6) To keep a receipt book, in which he shall take from every person to whom a grant shall be delivered, a receipt for the same; but he may 4 5 inclose grants by mail in a registered letter at the expense of the 6 grantee, unless otherwise directed, first entering the same upon the 7 receipt book; 8 To issue charters and all necessary certificates for the incorporation, (7) 9 domestication, suspension, reinstatement, cancellation and dissolution 10 of corporations as may be required by the corporation laws of the State and maintain a record thereof: 11 To issue certificates of registration of trademarks, labels and designs as 12 (8) 13 may be required by law and maintain a record thereof; To maintain a Division of Publications-Information Services to compile 14 (9) 15 data on the State's several governmental agencies and for legislative 16 reference: 17 (10)To receive, enroll and safely preserve the Constitution of the State and 18 all amendments thereto: 19 (11)To serve as a member of such boards and commissions as the 20 Constitution and laws of the State may designate; 21 (12)To administer the Securities Law of the State, regulating the issuance 22 and sale of securities, as is now or may be directed; To receive and keep all oaths of public officials required by law to be 23 (13)24 filed in his office, and as Secretary of State, he is fully empowered to 25 administer official oaths to any public official of whom an oath is required; and 26 27 To receive and maintain a journal of all appointments made to any (14)State board, agency, commission, council or authority which is filed in 28 29 the office of the Secretary of State."

Sec. 3. G.S. 147-45 reads as rewritten:

"§ 147-45. Distribution of copies of State publications.

The Secretary of State shall, at the State's expense, as soon as possible after publication, provide such number of copies of the Session Laws and Senate and House Journals to federal, State, and local governmental officials, departments and agencies, and to educational institutions of instruction and exchange use, as is set out in the table below:

One copy of the Session Laws shall be furnished the head of any department of State government created in the future.

State agencies, institutions, etc., not found in or covered by this list may, upon written request from their respective department head to the Secretary of State, and upon the discretion of the Secretary of State as to need, be issued copies of the Session Laws on a permanent loan basis with the understanding that should said copies be needed they will be recalled."

Sec. 4. G.S. 147-54 reads as rewritten:

"§ 147-54. Printing, distribution and sale of the North Carolina Manual.

The Secretary of State shall have printed biennially for distribution and sale, five up to ten thousand (5,000) (10,000) copies of the North Carolina Manual, and shall make distribution to the State agencies, individuals, institutions and others as herein set forth. Manual. The number of books for complimentary distribution as set out below are minimum figures and may be adjusted to reflect increases in quantity published:

After making the above distribution, the remainder shall-any remaining books may be sold at the cost of publication plus tax and a reasonable cost, to include postage and handling and any applicable taxes. the The proceeds from such any sales shall be deposited with the State Treasurer for use by the Publications Division publications section of the Department of the Secretary of State's Office State to defray the expense of publishing the North Carolina Manual. Libraries and cost of publication. Libraries, educational institutions—personnel and institutions, and other governmental units not covered—provided for in the above distribution—list shall be entitled to a twenty percent (20%) discount on the cost of any purchase(s)—the North Carolina Manual."

Sec. 5. G.S. 147-54.1 reads as rewritten:

"§ 147-54.1. Division of Publications; duties.

The Secretary of State is authorized to set up a division to be designated as the Division of <u>Publications-Information Services</u> and to appoint a director thereof who shall be known as the Director of <u>Publications. This Division-Information Services. The Division of Information Services shall have a Publications Section, an Information Management Section, and such other sections as may be deemed necessary by the Secretary of State.</u>

The Publications Section shall publish the North Carolina Manual, Directory, Index of Local Legislation the Directory of State and County Officials of North Carolina, and such other publications as may be useful to the members and committees of the General Assembly and other officials of the State and of the various counties and cities. Assembly, the department, and the citizens of North Carolina. The Secretary of State may sell these publications any publication at such prices as a price he deems reasonable; the proceeds of sale shall be paid into the State treasury. treasury unless other provisions are established by law.

The <u>Division Information Management Section</u> shall also perform all such other duties as may be assigned maintain any records received by the Secretary of <u>State</u>. State as prescribed by statute and provide information and copies of records and files upon request and for a fee as set by the Secretary of State or by law."

Sec. 6. This act is effective upon ratification.
