1	A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
2	AN ACT TO CLARIFY THE DESIGNATION OF CERTAIN OFFICIAL LICENSE
3	PLATES ISSUABLE ON REQUEST TO THE JUDICIARY AND TO PROVIDE
4	SEMIPERMANENT REGISTRATION PLATES FOR MEMBERS OF
5	VOLUNTEER FIRE DEPARTMENTS AND RESCUE SQUADS AND
6	AMATEUR RADIO OPERATORS.
7	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
8	Section 1. G.S. 20-81(3) reads as rewritten:
9	"(3) Judicial. – Official plates issued to the judiciary shall be issued as
10	follows:
11	a. Appellate division. – Official plates that shall be issued upon
12	request to the Chief Justice and Associate Justices of the
13	Supreme Court of North Carolina and the Chief Judge and
14	Associate Judges of North Carolina Court of Appeals shall bear
15	the letter 'J' followed by numerical designation from 1 through
16	19. The Chief Justice upon request shall be issued the plate
17	bearing number 1 and the remaining plates shall first be issued
18	upon request to the Associate Justices on the basis of seniority.
19	The Chief Judge shall be issued upon request the next such
20	judicial plate and the remaining plates shall be issued upon
21	request to the Associate Judges on the basis of seniority. Retired

1		members of the Supreme Court and the Court of Appeals shall
2		receive an official plate upon request similar in every respect to
3		the plate issued to the regular justices and judges bearing the
4		numerical designation of his or her position of seniority at the
5		time of retirement except that the numerical designation shall be
6		followed with the letter 'X'. Official plate J-20 may be issued
7		upon request to the Director of the Administrative Office of the
8		Courts.
9	b.	Superior court. – Official plates shall be issued to the various
10	0.	senior resident superior court judges upon request and shall bear
11		the letter 'J' followed by a numerical designation which for a
12		district as defined in G.S. 7A-41.1(a) shall be equal to the sum
12		of the numerical designation of their respective judicial districts
13		plus 20. Where there is more than one regular resident superior
15		court judge for such a district, official plates shall upon request
16		be issued to other resident judges of the district similar to the
17		official plate to be issued upon request to the senior resident
18		superior court judge of the district except the numerical
19		designation on each subsequent plate shall be followed by a
20		hyphen and a letter of the alphabet beginning with the letter 'A',
21		which shall be indicative of the recipient's position as to
22		seniority. The numerical designation for the senior resident
23		superior court judge for a set of districts as defined in G.S. 7A-
24		41.1(a) shall be equal to the sum of 20 plus the numerical
25		designation which the districts in the set have in common and
26		shall be followed by no letter, and the numerical designation for
27		each other regular resident superior court judge of the set of
28		districts shall have the same numerical designation as that of the
29		senior resident superior court judge and shall be followed by a
30		hyphen and a letter of the alphabet beginning with the letter 'A'
31		which shall indicate the recipient's position as to seniority
32		among all of the regular resident superior court judges of the set
33		of districts and shall not necessarily correspond with the letter
34		designation of the superior court district established under G.S.
35		7A-41 for which he is a resident judge, provided that in the set
36		of districts 7B and 7C, the senior resident superior court judge
37		for that set shall be issued on request an official plate bearing
38		the designation $\frac{27BC}{27C}$ following the letter 'J', and all other
39		resident superior court judges of the set shall be issued on
40		request an official plate bearing that designation followed by $\frac{1}{2}$
41		hyphen and a letter of the alphabet beginning with the letter 'A'
42		indicating that judge's position as to seniority among all the regular

8	g. United States marshals. – Official plates shall be issued upon
9	request to the United States Marshals, which plates shall bear
10	the letters, 'U.S. Marshal', followed by a numerical designation
11	indicative of their district, with 1 being the Eastern District, 2
12	being the Middle District, and 3 being the Western District."
13	Sec. 2. G.S. 20-81.7 reads as rewritten:
14	"(a) Every owner of a private passenger motor vehicle or pickup truck not
15	exceeding a gross weight of 4,000 pounds, who is an active, regular, or volunteer
16	member of a fire department or rescue squad, upon payment of registration and
17	licensing fees for such vehicle as required by law and an additional initial fee of ten
18	dollars (\$10.00), shall be issued license plates of the same form and character as other
19	license plates now or hereinafter authorized by law to be issued upon such vehicles
20	except that such license plates shall in addition bear on the face thereof the following
21	words: either 'fireman'; 'rescue squad' or 'fireman-rescue squad.' Special registration
22	plates issued pursuant to this section shall be valid for five years and shall be renewed
23	through the use of annual renewal stickers in the same manner as regular registration
24	plates are renewed. When the holder of a special registration plate issued pursuant to
25	this section becomes ineligible for it he shall exchange the plate for a regular plate
26	within 30 days.
27	(b) Application for special registration plates pursuant to this section shall be made on
28	forms provided by the Division of Motor Vehicles and shall contain proof satisfactory
29	to the Division that the applicant is an active regular or volunteer member of a fire
30	department or rescue squad. Applications must be filed prior to 60 days before the day when
31	regular registration plates for the year are made available to motor vehicle owners. <u>Special</u>
32	registration plates issued pursuant to this section shall be valid for five years with no
33	additional fee for the specialized plate and the plates shall be renewed annually, as
34	provided in subsection (a), in the month of June beginning in the 1990 registration year.
35	(c) Repealed by Session Laws 1981 (Regular Session, 1982), c. 1258, s. 13."
36	Sec. 3. G.S. 20-81.1(b) reads as rewritten:
37	"(b) Application for special registration plates shall be made on forms which shall
38	be provided by the Division of Motor Vehicles and shall contain proof satisfactory to
39	the Division that the applicant holds an unrevoked and unexpired official amateur radio
40	license and shall state the call letters which have been assigned to the applicant. The
41	special registration plates shall provide for call letters with numerical or letter suffixes
42	so that an owner of more than one vehicle may have the call letters on each.
43	Applications must be filed prior to 60 days before the day when regular registration plates for
44	the year are made available to motor vehicle owners-Special registration plates issued

- 2 specialized plate and the plates shall be renewed annually, as provided in subsection (c),
- 3 in the month of June beginning in the 1990 registration year."
- 4 Sec. 4. Section 1 of this act is effective upon ratification and shall apply to
- 5 each effected person on the date of the first subsequent regular renewal of his existing
- 6 plate, or upon the date of the subsequent regular issuance of his first plate. The
- 7 remainder of this act shall become effective October 1, 1989.
