A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 2 AN ACT TO ALLOW THE PURCHASE OF CERTAIN TEMPORARY SERVICE 3 SERVED AFTER FULL-TIME SERVICE IN THE TEACHERS' AND STATE 4 EMPLOYEES' RETIREMENT SYSTEM. 5 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: Section 1. G.S. 135-4(s) reads as rewritten: 6 "(s) Credit at Full Cost for Temporary State Employment. - In addition to the 7 provisions of subsection (p) above, any member may purchase creditable service for 8 State employment when classified as a temporary teacher or employee subject to the 9 conditions that the: 10 Member was employed by an employer as defined in G.S. 135-1(11); 11 (1) Member's temporary employment met all other requirements of G.S. 12 (2) 135-1(10) or (25); 13 Member has completed five years or more of membership service; 14 (3) Member acquires from the employer such certifications of temporary 15 (4) employment as are required by the Board of Trustees; and 16 Member makes a lump sum payment into the Annuity Savings Fund 17 (5) equal to the full liability of the service credits calculated on the basis 18 of the assumptions used for purposes of the actuarial valuation of the 19 Retirement System's liabilities and shall take into account the 20 21 retirement allowance arising on account of the additional service credit commencing at the earliest age at which the member could retire on an 22

unreduced retirement allowance, as determined by the Board of

Trustees upon the advice of the actuary, plus an administrative expense fee to be determined by the Board of Trustees.

The provisions of this subsection shall also apply to the purchase of creditable service for State employment when classified as a permanent hourly employee in accordance with G.S. 126-5(c4).

Under all requirements and conditions set forth in the preceding paragraph of this subsection (s), except for the requirement that the completion of five years of membership service be after State employment when classified as a temporary teacher or employee, any member with five or more years of membership service standing to his credit may purchase creditable service for such temporary employment if (i) the member terminates or has terminated State employment in any capacity, (ii) the purchase of the additional creditable service causes the member to become eligible to commence an early or service retirement allowance and (iii) the member immediately elects to commence retirement and become a beneficiary."

Sec. 2. This act shall become effective July 1, 1989, and applies to purchases on and after that date.
