G.S. 20-81.3(b) reads as rewritten: 6 An owner who desires personalized registration plates shall make application 7 "(b) for such plates on forms which shall be provided by the Division of Motor Vehicles and 8 pay the sum of ten dollars (\$10.00) twenty dollars (\$20.00) annually, which shall be in 9 addition to the regular motor vehicle registration fee. Once an owner has obtained 10 personalized plates, he, where possible, will have first priority on those plates for the 11 following years provided he makes timely and appropriate application; provided, 12 however, that the Commissioner shall not issue a personalized license plate pursuant to 13 this section except upon written application therefor on a form furnished by the 14 Commissioner in which the applicant certifies that his operator's or chauffeur's license 15 has not been revoked or suspended under Article 2 of Chapter 20 of the General Statutes 16 within two years prior to the date of the application; and provided, further, that any 17 personalized license plate issued pursuant to this section shall be cancelled and recalled 18 by the Commissioner and the application fee forfeited in the event that the 19 20 Commissioner determines that a false application has been submitted." Sec. 2. G.S. 20-81.3 is amended by adding a new subsection to read: 21

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"(c1) Ten dollars (\$10.00) of the revenue derived from the additional fee for the
special personalized registration plates shall be placed in a separate fund designated the
'Natural Heritage Trust Vehicle Registration Fund'. The monies in the fund shall be
transferred quarterly to the account of the State Treasurer for use in the Recreation and
Natural Heritage Trust Fund found in Article 5A of Chapter 113 of the General
Statutes."
Sec. 3. This act shall become effective July 31, 1989.
