Short Title: Axle Requirements for Certain Trucks.

1 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
2 AN ACT TO AMEND THE AXLE REQUIREMENTS FOR MOTOR HOMES AND
3 CERTAIN TRUCKS.

4 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

5 Section 1. G.S. 20-116(d) reads as rewritten:

6 "(d) A single vehicle ~~having two~~ regardless of the number of axles shall not exceed
7 ~~35-45~~ feet in length of extreme overall dimensions inclusive of front and rear bumpers.
8 Provided, however, a bus or motor home with two axles ~~may be up to~~ shall not exceed 40
9 feet in length overall of dimensions inclusive of front and rear bumpers. ~~A vehicle having~~
10 ~~three axles shall not exceed 40 feet in length overall of dimensions inclusive of front and rear~~
11 ~~bumpers.~~ Provided, further, trucks transporting unprocessed cotton from farm to gin
12 shall not exceed 48 feet in length overall of dimensions inclusive of front and rear
13 bumpers. A truck-tractor and semitrailer shall be regarded as two vehicles for the
14 purpose of determining lawful length and license taxes."

15 Sec. 2. G.S. 20-4.01(27) reads as rewritten:

16 "(27) Passenger Vehicles. –

- 17 a. Excursion passenger vehicles. – Vehicles transporting persons
18 on sight-seeing or travel tours.
- 19 b. For hire passenger vehicles. – Vehicles transporting persons for
20 compensation. This classification shall not include vehicles
21 operated as ambulances; vehicles operated by the owner where
22 the costs of operation are shared by the passengers; vehicles
23 operated pursuant to a ridesharing arrangement as defined in

- 1 G.S. 136-44.21; vehicles transporting students for the public
2 school system under contract with the State Board of Education
3 or vehicles leased to the United States of America or any of its
4 agencies on a nonprofit basis; or vehicles used for human
5 service or volunteer transportation.
- 6 c. Common carriers of passengers. – Vehicles operated under a
7 franchise certificate issued by the Utilities Commission for
8 operation on the highways of this State between fixed termini or
9 over a regular route for the transportation of persons or property
10 for compensation.
- 11 d. Motorcycles. – Vehicles having a saddle for the use of the rider
12 and designed to travel on not more than three wheels in contact
13 with the ground, including motor scooters and motor-driven
14 bicycles, but excluding tractors and utility vehicles equipped
15 with an additional form of device designed to transport
16 property, three-wheeled vehicles while being used by law-
17 enforcement agencies and mopeds as defined in subdivision d1
18 of this subsection.
- 19 d1. Moped. – Vehicles having two or three wheels and operable
20 pedals and equipped with a motor which does not exceed 50
21 cubic centimeters piston displacement and cannot propel the
22 vehicle at a speed greater than 20 miles per hour on a level
23 surface.
- 24 d2. Motor home or house car. – A vehicular unit, designed to
25 provide temporary living quarters, built into as an integral part,
26 or permanently attached to, a self-propelled motor vehicle
27 chassis or van. The vehicle must provide at least four of the
28 following facilities: cooking, refrigeration or icebox, self-
29 contained toilet, heating or air conditioning, a portable water
30 supply system including a faucet and sink, separate 110-125
31 volt electrical power supply, or an LP gas supply.
- 32 e. U-drive-it passenger vehicles. – Vehicles rented or leased to be
33 operated by the lessee. This shall not include vehicles of nine-
34 passenger capacity or less which are leased for a term of one
35 year or more to the same person or vehicles leased or rented to
36 public school authorities for driver-training instruction.
- 37 f. Ambulances. – Vehicles equipped for transporting wounded,
38 injured, or sick persons.
- 39 g. Private passenger vehicles. – All other passenger vehicles not
40 included in the above definitions."

41 Sec. 2.1. G.S. 20-116(f) reads as rewritten:

- 42 "(f) The load upon any vehicle operated alone, or the load upon the front vehicle
43 of a combination of vehicles, shall not extend more than three feet beyond the front
44 wheels of such vehicle or the front bumper of such vehicle, if it is equipped with such a

- 1 bumper. Under this subsection 'load' shall include the boom on a self-propelled
2 vehicle."
3 Sec. 3. This act is effective upon ratification.
