2	AN ACT TO PROVIDE FOR MORE STRINGENT REQUIREMENTS ON
3	HAZARDOUS WASTE LANDFILLS BY REQUIRING ALL WASTE BE
4	PLACED IN CONTAINERS PRIOR TO DISPOSAL AND TO AMEND THE
5	GENERAL STATUTES CONCERNING RESIDENT INSPECTOR RULES AT
6	SPECIAL PURPOSE COMMERCIAL HAZARDOUS WASTE FACILITIES.
7	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
8	Section 1. G.S. 130A-294(c) is amended by adding a new subdivision to
9	read:
10	"(19) All waste shall be packed in containers for disposal, except as the
11	Commission shall provide for by rule. For purposes of this section, the
12	term 'container' means any portable device into which waste is placed
13	for storage, transportation, treatment, disposal, or other handling, and
14	includes the first enclosure which encompasses the waste. The
15	Commission shall adopt standards for the design and construction of
16	containers for disposal. Standards for containers may vary for
17	different types of waste. The standards for disposal containers may
18	supplement or duplicate any of the performance or engineering
19	standards for hazardous waste disposal facilities required under State
20	or federal law, however, the performance or engineering standards for
21	hazardous waste disposal facilities are separate and cumulative, and
22	the performance or engineering standards for hazardous waste disposal
23	facilities and containers may not substitute for or replace one another."

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1	Sec. 2. G.S. 130A-295.02(j) reads as rewritten:
2	"(j) The Commission may shall adopt rules establishing reasonable times and
3	frequencies for the presence of a resident inspector on less than a full-time basis at
4	special purpose commercial hazardous waste facilities which manage limited quantities of
5	hazardous waste. facilities pursuant to this section. For purposes of this subsection,
6	special purpose commercial hazardous waste facilities include: a facility which manages
7	limited quantities of hazardous waste; a facility which limits its hazardous waste
8	management activities to reclamation or recycling, including energy or materials
9	recovery or a facility which stores hazardous waste primarily for use at such facilities;
10	or a facility which is determined to be low risk under rules adopted by the Commission
11	pursuant to this subsection. Rules providing for resident inspectors on less than a full-time
12	basis shall be based on such factors as the smallness of the facility,-Rules adopted pursuant
13	to this subsection shall establish classifications of special purpose hazardous waste
14	facilities based on factors including, but not limited to, the size of the facility, the type
15	of treatment or storage being performed, the nature and volume of waste being treated,
16	treated or stored, the uniformity, similarity, or lack of diversity of the waste streams, the
17	predictability of the nature of the waste streams and their treatability, whether the
18	facility utilizes automated monitoring or safety devices which adequately perform
19	functions that would otherwise be performed by a resident inspector, the fact that
20	reclamation or recycling is being performed at the facility and the compliance history of
21	the facility and its operator. Such rules shall specify a minimum number of inspections
22	during such times as the facility is in operation, undergoing any maintenance or repair,
23	or undergoing any test or calibration. Commercial hazardous waste facilities that utilize
24	hazardous waste as a fuel source shall be inspected a minimum of 40 hours per week.
25	Special purpose commercial hazardous waste facilities shall be subject to inspection at
26	all times. The Department shall keep records of all inspections and shall certify that the
27	resident inspectors have complied with this requirement."
28	Sec. 3. This act is effective upon ratification.
