2	AN ACT TO CLARIFY THE PUBLIC ENTERPRISE LAW WITH RESPECT TO
3	STORMWATER UTILITIES ESTABLISHED BY CITIES AND COUNTIES AND
4	TO GIVE WATER AND SEWER AUTHORITIES THE ABILITY TO OPERATE
5	AND FINANCE STORMWATER UTILITIES.
6	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
7	Section 1. G.S. 160A-314 reads as rewritten:
8	"§ 160A-314. Authority to fix and enforce rates.
9	(a) A city may establish and revise from time to time schedules of rents, rates,
10	fees, charges, and penalties for the use of or the services furnished by any public
11	enterprise. Schedules of rents, rates, fees, charges, and penalties may vary according to
12	classes of service, and different schedules may be adopted for services provided outside
13	the corporate limits of the city.
14	(a1) Before it establishes or revises a schedule of rates, fees, charges, or penalties
15	for structural and natural stormwater and drainage systems under this section, the city
16	council shall hold a public hearing on the matter. A notice of the hearing shall be given
17	at least once in a newspaper having general circulation in the area, not less than seven
18	days before the public hearing. The hearing may be held concurrently with the public
19	hearing on the proposed budget ordinance.
20	Schedules of rates, fees, charges, and penalties for providing structural and natural
21	stormwater and drainage system service may vary according to whether the property
22	served is residential, commercial, or industrial property, the property's use, the size of
23	the property, the area of impervious surfaces on the property, the quantity and quality of

from the property drains, and other factors that affect the stormwater drainage system. 1 2 Rates, fees, and charges imposed under this section may not exceed the city's cost of 3 providing a stormwater and drainage system. (b) A city shall have power to collect delinquent accounts by any remedy 4 5 provided by law for collecting and enforcing private debts, debts, and may specify by 6 ordinance the order in which partial payments are to be applied among the various 7 enterprise services covered by the bill. A city may also discontinue service to any 8 customer whose account remains delinquent for more than 10 days. When service is 9 discontinued for delinquency, it shall be unlawful for any person other than a duly 10 authorized agent or employee of the city to do any act that results in a resumption of services. If a delinquent customer is not the owner of the premises to which the services 11 12 are delivered, the payment of the delinquent account may not be required before providing services at the request of a new and different tenant or occupant of the 13 14 premises, but this restriction shall not apply when the premises are occupied by two or 15 more tenants whose services are measured by the same meter. 16 (c)Except as provided in subsection (d), rents, rates, fees, charges, and penalties 17 for enterprisory services shall be legal obligations of the person contracting for them, 18 and shall in no case be a lien upon the property or premises served. served, provided that no contract shall be necessary in the case of structural and natural stormwater and 19 20 drainage systems. 21 (d) Rents, rates, fees, charges, and penalties for enterprisory services shall be 22 legal obligations of the owner of the premises served when: 23 The property or premises is leased or rented to more than one tenant (1)24 and services rendered to more than one tenant are measured by the 25 same meter. 26 (2)Charges made for use of a sewage system are billed separately from 27 charges made for the use of a water distribution system. Nothing in this section shall repeal any portion of any city charter 28 (e) 29 inconsistent herewith." 30 Sec. 2. G.S. 153A-277 reads as rewritten: 31 "§ 153A-277. Authority to fix and enforce rates. 32 A county may establish and revise from time to time schedules of rents, rates, (a) fees, charges, and penalties for the use of or the services furnished by a public 33 34 enterprise. Schedules of rents, rates, fees, charges, and penalties may vary for the same 35 class of service in different areas of the county and may vary according to classes of 36 service, and different schedules may be adopted for services provided outside of the 37 county. 38 Before it establishes or revises a schedule of rates, fees, charges, or penalties (a1) 39 for structural and natural stormwater and drainage systems under this section, the board of commissioners shall hold a public hearing on the matter. A notice of the hearing 40 41 shall be given at least once in a newspaper having general circulation in the area, not 42 less than seven days before the public hearing. The hearing may be held concurrently with the public hearing on the proposed budget ordinance. 43

Schedules of rates, fees, charges, and penalties for providing structural and natural 1 stormwater and drainage system service may vary according to whether the property 2 3 served is residential, commercial, or industrial property, the property's use, the size of the property, the area of impervious surfaces on the property, the quantity and quality of 4 5 the runoff from the property, the characteristics of the watershed into which stormwater 6 from the property drains, and other factors that affect the stormwater drainage system. 7 Rates, fees, and charges imposed under this section may not exceed the county's cost of 8 providing a stormwater and drainage system. 9 (b) A county may collect delinquent accounts by any remedy provided by law for 10 collecting and enforcing private debts. debts, and may specify by ordinance the order in which partial payments are to be applied among the various enterprise services covered 11 12 by the bill. A county may also discontinue service to a customer whose account remains delinquent for more than 10 days. If a delinquent customer is not the owner of 13 14 the premises to which the services are delivered, the payment of the delinquent account 15 may not be required before providing services at the request of a new and different tenant or occupant of the premises. If water or sewer services are discontinued for 16 17 delinquency, it is unlawful for a person other than a duly authorized agent or employee 18 of the county to reconnect the premises to the water or sewer system. 19 (c)Rents, rates, fees, charges, and penalties for enterprisory services are in no 20 case a lien upon the property or premises served and, except as provided in subsection 21 (d) of this section, are legal obligations of the person contracting for them, them, provided that no contract shall be necessary in the case of structural and natural 22 23 stormwater and drainage systems. Rents, rates, fees, charges, and penalties for enterprisory services are legal 24 (d) obligations of the owner of the property or premises served when: 25 26 The property or premises is leased or rented to more than one tenant (1)27 and services rendered to more than one tenant are measured by the same meter; or 28 29 Charges made for use of a sewerage system are billed separately from (2)30 charges made for the use of a water distribution system." Sec. 3. G.S. 162A-2(12) reads as rewritten: 31 32 "(12) The term 'water system' shall mean and include all plants, 33 systems, facilities or properties used or useful or having the present 34 capacity for future use in connection with the supply or distribution 35 of water, water or the control and drainage of stormwater runoff and any integral part thereof, including but not limited to water supply 36 37 systems, water distribution systems, structural and natural 38 stormwater and drainage systems of all types, sources of water 39 supply including lakes, reservoirs and wells, intakes, mains, laterals, pumping standpipes, aqueducts. stations. plants, 40 filtration 41 purification plants, hydrants, meters, valves, and all necessary 42 appurtenances and equipment and all properties, rights, easements 43 and franchises relating thereto and deemed necessary or convenient 44 by the authority for the operation thereof."

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1	Sec. 4. G.S. 162A-9 reads as rewritten:			
2	"§ 162A-9. Rates and charges; contracts for water or services; deposits; delinquent			
3	charges.			
4	(a) Each authority shall fix, and may revise from time to time, reasonable rates,			
5	fees and other charges for the use of and for the services furnished or to be furnished by			
6 7	any water system or sewer system or parts thereof owned or operated by such authority. Such rates, fees and charges shall not be subject to supervision or regulation by any			
8	bureau, board, commission or other agency of the State or of any political subdivision.			
9	Before an authority sets or revises rates, fees, or other charges for structural or			
10	natural stormwater and drainage system service, the authority shall hold a public			
11	hearing on the matter. At least seven days before the hearing, the authority shall publish			
12	notice of the public hearing in a newspaper having general circulation in the area. An			
13	authority may impose rates, fees, or other charges for stormwater and drainage system			
14	service on a person even though the person has not entered into a contract to receive the			
15	service.			
16	Such rates, fees Rates, fees, and charges shall be fixed and revised so that the			
17	revenues of the authority, together with any other available funds, will be sufficient at			
18	all times:			
19	(1) To pay the cost of maintaining, repairing and operating the systems			
20 21	or parts thereof owned or operated by the authority, including			
21 22	reserves for such purposes, and including provision for the payment of principal of and interest on indebtedness of a political subdivision			
22	or of political subdivisions which payment shall have been assumed			
23 24	by the authority, and			
25	(2) To pay the principal of and the interest on all bonds issued by the			
26	authority under the provisions of this Article as the same shall			
27	become due and payable and to provide reserves therefor.			
28	Schedules of rates, fees, charges, and penalties for providing structural and natural			
29	stormwater and drainage system service may vary according to whether the property			
30	served is residential, commercial, or industrial property, the property's use, the size of			
31	the property, the area of impervious surfaces on the property, the quantity and quality of			
32	the runoff from the property, the characteristics of the watershed into which stormwater			
33	from the property drains, and other factors that affect the stormwater drainage system.			
34	Rates, fees, and charges imposed under this section may not exceed the authority's cost			
35	of providing a stormwater and drainage system.			
36	(b) Notwithstanding any of the foregoing provisions of this section, the authority			
37 38	may enter into contracts relating to the collection, treatment or disposal of sewage or the			
38 39	purchase or sale of water which shall not be subject to revision except in accordance with their terms.			
40	(c) In order to insure the payment of such rates, fees and charges as the same			
41	shall become due and payable, the authority may, may do the following in addition to			
42	exercising any other remedies which it may have:

1	(1)	Require reasonable advance deposits to be made with it to be subject		
2		to application to the payment of delinquent rates, fees and <del>charges,</del>		
3		and charges.		
4	(2)	At the expiration of 30 days after any such-rates, fees and charges		
5		become delinquent, discontinue supplying water or the services and		
6		facilities of any water system or sewer system of the authority.		
7	<u>(3)</u>	Specify the order in which partial payments are to be applied when a		
8		bill covers more than one service."		
9	Sec. 5. No stormwater utility fee may be levied pursuant to this act whenever			
10	two or more	units of local government operate separate structural and natural		
11	stormwater and drainage system services in the same area within a county. However,			
12	two or more units of local government may allocate among themselves the functions,			
13	duties, powers, and responsibilities for jointly operating a single structural and natural			
14	stormwater and drainage system service in the same area within a county, provided that			
15	only one unit may levy a fee pursuant to this act within the joint service area. For			
16	purposes of this section, a unit of local government shall include a regional authority			
17	providing structural and natural stormwater and drainage system services.			
18	Sec. 6. This act is effective upon ratification.			
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
