A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT TO PROVIDE THAT THERE SHALL BE NO SURCHARGES OR PREMIUM INCREASES OF ANY KIND WHEN AN INSURED PAYS FOR THE 4 DAMAGES IN AN ACCIDENT INVOLVING PROPERTY DAMAGE ONLY AND THE INSURANCE COMPANY DOES NOT HAVE TO PAY ANY CLAIMS.

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

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17 18 Section 1. G.S. 58-36-75(e) reads as rewritten:

There shall be no Facility recoupment surcharge under G.S. 58-37-40(f) or other surcharges, S.D.I.P. points, or premium increases of any kind for any accident involving only damage to the operator's vehicle or to the property of another for which full payment or compensation has been made by the operator at fault; and when the motor vehicle insurer of the operator has not made any payment under any kind of insurance policy for such property damage to or on behalf of such operator. Notwithstanding the provision of this subsection, an insured still has a duty to report such accident to his insurer and to law enforcement authorities if such duty is required by the insurance contract or by law."

Sec. 2. This act is effective upon ratification.
