2	AN ACT TO ESTABLISH THE PROJECT GENESIS PROGRAM, AN		
3	EXPERIMENT WITH A RESTRUCTURED SCHOOL APPROACH FOR THE		
4	PUBLIC SCHOOLS.		
5	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:		
6	Section 1. Article 16 of Chapter 115C of the General Statutes is amended by		
7	adding a new Part to read:		
8	" <u>PART 5. PROJECT GENESIS PROGRAM.</u>		
9	" <u>§ 115C-238.12. Creation of program; purpose.</u>		
10	(a) The State Board of Education may establish a Project Genesis Pilot Program		
11	in the Gaston, Cumberland, Johnston, and Wake County School Administrative Units.		
12	(b) The purpose of the pilot program shall be to enable up to two schools in each		
13	participating local school administrative unit to experiment with a restructured school		
14	approach that would combine the concepts of flexibility, competitive bidding on the		
15	management of schools, accountability, and, whenever possible, inter-public school		
16	choice. Participating local school administrative units shall have four years to (i)		
17	determine the feasibility of the project, (ii) secure private funding for any additional		
18	funds required for the project, (iii) lay the groundwork for the project, and (iv) if they		
19	decide to proceed with the project, begin experimentation in not more than two schools		
20	per local school administrative unit.

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1	. ,	local board of education in a participating local school administrative
2		t a school building that is under construction as its first school under the
3	project.	
4		local board shall issue a request for proposals for teams of educators to
5	-	he selected school. Each team shall include one individual who shall be
6		principal or leader of the school and at least four teachers who shall
7	-	ore leadership team before and during the opening of the new school.
8		e team shall not be required to meet certification requirements.
9	-	for proposals shall include a minimum of requirements. Requirements
10	may include:	
11	<u>(1)</u>	A statement of principles that the local board of education wants the
12		bidding teams to address;
13	<u>(2)</u>	A specified amount of money available for the operation of the
14		building, which amount shall be within the limits of funds typically
15		available for the size of school being opened for bid;
16	<u>(3)</u>	A framework for accountability plans by which the success of the
17		project site can be measured, which accountability plans shall include
18		the student performance indicators adopted by the State Board of
19		Education pursuant to G.S. 115C-238.1(3), and may include factors
20		such as student, parent, and employee satisfaction, parental
21		involvement, community service, and evidence of a focus on
22		developing thinking and reasoning skills;
23	<u>(4)</u>	When inter-public school choice is a part of the project, a marketing
24		component for attracting parents to enroll their children in the building
25		when it opens, with the goal that thirty percent (30%) to fifty percent
26		(50%) of the students will be children whose parents selected the
27		school because of its unique philosophy and plans; and
28	<u>(5)</u>	Other requirements deemed necessary by the local school
29		administrative unit.
30	<u>(c)</u> <u>The</u>	ocal board of education shall appoint an advisory committee composed
31	of educators, e	lected officials, and business leaders from within and without the local
32		trative unit to screen proposals for the school building and to make
33	recommendatio	ns to the local board of education on the proposals.
34	The local be	bard shall consider the recommendations of the advisory committee and
35	shall award the	<u>contract.</u>
36	(d) The t	eam that receives the contract shall interview and select all personnel for
37	the building.	The team may select personnel from the current employees of the local
38	board. Hiring	shall take place no later that July 1 prior to the opening of the new
39	building. The	team shall begin conducting training and planning sessions as staff is
40	hired.	
41	<u>(e)</u> <u>The</u>	participating school building shall initiate a comprehensive
42	accountability	program from the day school begins. The results shall be published
43	annually and co	mpared to those of traditional schools.

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1	(f) After the third and fourth years of the project, the local board of education
2	shall review student outcome results of the existing project site and shall decide whether
3	an additional building within the school system shall be added to the project. The
4	second school chosen for the project shall be either (i) another new school building or
5	(ii) the existing school that is producing the poorest results in student achievement or
6	that has the worst results in student discipline, the dropout rate, and student motivation.
7	" <u>§ 115C-238.14. Grants of flexibility by the State Board.</u>
8	In implementing local projects, local boards of education need broad decision-
9	making authority so that local boards of education and participating school leadership
10	teams can carry out the activities that meet the needs of students in that particular
11	building. Each participating local school administrative unit shall request from the State
12	Board of Education, with specificity, those aspects of its project implementation that
13	would be enhanced by flexibility with regard to statutes, policies, and regulations. The
14	State Board of Education may grant each local school administrative unit such
15	flexibility with regard to State statutes, policies, and regulations as it finds necessary
16	and appropriate to implement a local project so long as (i) the projects and activities
17	are carried out within total funds available for that purpose, (ii) no health or safety
18	standards relating to schools or school transportation are lowered, and (iii) the State
19	Board of Education does not find as a fact that the flexibility is being abused.
20	The State Board of Education shall report such flexibility with regard to statutes,
21	policies, and regulations granted to projects to the Joint Legislative Commission on
22	Governmental Operations.
23	" <u>§ 115C-238.15. Reporting requirements.</u>
24	Each participating local school administrative unit shall submit an annual report on
25	its activities to the Joint Legislative Commission on Governmental Operations, the
26	Superintendent of Public Instruction, and the State Board of Education."
