1	A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
2	AN ACT TO AUTHORIZE THE LEGISLATIVE RESEARCH COMMISSION TO
3	STUDY TOURISM'S GROWTH AND EFFECT.
4	Whereas, Chapter 873 of the 1987 Session Laws authorized the Legislative
5	Research Commission to study tourism's growth and effect; and
6	Whereas, the 1988-89 Study Committee on Tourism's Growth and Effect
7	began a comprehensive review of the tourism industry and its impact on North Carolina;
8	and
9	Whereas, while the 1988-89 Study Committee on Tourism's Growth and
10	Effect made significant progress in evaluating the rapid growth of the tourism industry
11	and the substantial effects of that growth on the State, it was unable to examine all of
12	the issues that should be addressed; and
13	Whereas, the 1988-89 Study Committee on Tourism's Growth and Effect
14	identified many important issues that need further examination; and
15	Whereas, as recommended by the 1988-89 Study Committee on Tourism's
16	Growth and Effect, the Legislative Research Commission continued its study of this
17	topic by creating the 1990-91 Study Committee on Tourism's Growth and Effect; and
18	Whereas, the 1990-91 Study Committee on Tourism's Growth and Effect
19	continued the earlier committee's comprehensive review of tourism's growth and effect
20	in this State and learned that North Carolina's market share of the tourism business
21	among the southeastern states has decreased for the last four years; and
22	Whereas, additional study is needed to develop State and local strategies to
23	enhance tourism and maximize its positive economic effect in North Carolina; Now,
24	therefore,

- 1 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
- 2 Section 1. The Legislative Research Commission is authorized to renew its 3 study of the issue of the growth of tourism in North Carolina, the impact of this growth 4 on the State, how to enhance the growth of tourism in North Carolina, and how to 5 ensure that all areas of the State benefit from this growth.
- 6 Sec. 2. The Legislative Research Commission may make an interim report to 7 the 1992 Session of the General Assembly, and shall make a final report to the 1993 8 Session of the General Assembly.
- 9 Sec. 3. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Legislative 10 Research Commission the sum of \$35,000 for the 1991-92 fiscal year to fund the study 11 described in Section 1 of this act.
- 12 Sec. 4. This act becomes effective July 1, 1991.
