8	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
9	Section 1. There is hereby established the Inter-agency Task Force on State
10	Agency Oversight of Workplace Safety and Health. The Task Force shall study the
11	regulatory responsibilities of State and local governmental agencies involved with
12	workplace safety and health and fire safety. The members shall include a representative
13	of each of the following:
14	(1) The Commissioner of Labor, who shall also chair the Task Force;
15	(2) The Commissioner of Insurance or a designee;
16	(3) The Secretary of the Department of Environment, Health, and Natural
17	Resources or a designee;
18	(4) The Chairman of the Industrial Commission or a designee;
19	(5) The Chairman of the Public Utilities Commission or a designee;
20	(6) The Secretary of the Department of Transportation or a designee;
21	(7) The Chairman of the State Personnel Commission or a designee;
22	(8) A community college representative appointed by the President of the
23	North Carolina System of Community Colleges; and

1	(9) Two local officials, one selected by the North Carolina League				
2	Municipalities and the other selected by the North Caroli	na

4	The Task Force shall submit a written report to the LRC Study Committee				
5	Fire and Occupational Safety at Industrial and Commercial Facilities no later than				
6	October 1, 1992. The report shall recommend a proposed reorganization of t				
7	occupational health and safety and fire safety network within State and log				
8	government to better address the needs of employers and employees in this Sta				
9	Except for cause, the same designee shall serve from the inception of the Task For	ce

11	The proposed reorganization should accomplish the following goals:
