A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT TO PROVIDE FUNDING TO DISSEMINATE HOSIERY TECHNOLOGY THROUGH A HOSIERY TECHNOLOGY CENTER UNDER THE SUPERVISION OF THE DEPARTMENT OF COMMUNITY COLLEGES.

Whereas, 43,900 North Carolinians with a combined payroll of more than \$600,000,000 working in 352 plants produce \$2 billion worth of hosiery, which is more than half the hosiery produced in the United States; and

Whereas, suppliers to this industry employ an additional large number of North Carolinians; and

Whereas, the international market offers opportunities to export hosiery but increasingly threatens domestic manufacturers with low-wage competition; and

Whereas, the training of employees in the North Carolina hosiery industry is critical to the health of this industry and to the economy of North Carolina; and

Whereas, modern hosiery technology, if fully utilized, would improve the productivity and increase the competitiveness of the North Carolina hosiery industry; and

Whereas, a cost-efficient and effective way to make use of modern hosiery technology is to provide training and technical materials to designated employees who will train other employees in their companies; Now, therefore,

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

Section 1. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of Community Colleges the sum of one hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$150,000) for the 1993-94 fiscal year and the sum of two hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$250,000) for

- 1 the 1994-95 fiscal year to fund a Hosiery Technology Center. This act will provide
- 2 technological services to hosiery manufacturers operating in North Carolina.
- 3 Sec. 2. This act becomes effective July 1, 1993.
