1 Secretary of Human Resources or his delegate; the State Health Director or his delegate, 2 and one public member appointed by the Governor. 3 "§ 120-191. Time of appointments; terms of office. Appointments to the Commission shall be made within 15 days subsequent to the 4 5 close of each regular session of the General Assembly. The term of office shall begin 6 on the day of appointment and shall end on the date when the next appointments are 7 made. Vacancies occurring during a term shall be filled for the unexpired term by the 8 officer who made the original appointment. 9 "§ 120-192. Organization of Commission. 10 Upon its appointment the Commission shall organize by electing from its membership a chair. The President Pro Tempore of the Senate or the Speaker of the 11 12 House of Representatives shall preside over the Commission until the Commission has elected a chair. The Commission shall meet at such times and places as the chair shall 13 designate. The facilities of the State Legislative Building and the Legislative Office 14 15 Building shall be available to the Commission. The Commission shall be funded by 24 the Legislative Services Commission from appropriations made to the General 25 Assembly for that purpose. "§ 120-194. Assistance to Commission. 26 The Commission, in the performance of its duties, may request and shall receive 27 from every department, board, bureau, agency, commission, or institution of this State, 28 29 or from any political subdivision of the State, information, cooperation, and assistance. 30 "§ 120-195.
