2 AN ACT TO CLARIFY THE CHILD-CARING INSTITUTIONS' LICENSING
3 EXEMPTIONS.

4 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

5 Section 1. G.S. 131D-10.4 reads as rewritten:

6 **"§ 131D-10.4. Exemptions.**

7 This Article shall not apply to:

- 8 (1) ~~Any residential child care facility chartered by the laws of the State of~~
9 ~~North Carolina (or operating under charters of other states which have~~
10 ~~complied with the corporation laws of North Carolina) which has a~~
11 ~~plant and assets worth sixty thousand dollars (\$60,000) or more and~~
12 ~~which is owned or operated by a religious denomination or fraternal~~
13 ~~order and which was in operation before July 1, 1977;~~
14 (2) State institutions for emotionally disturbed or delinquent children, the
15 mentally ill, mentally retarded, and substance abusers;
16 (3) Secure detention facilities as specified in Article 5 of Chapter 134A of
17 the General Statutes;
18 (4) Licensable facilities subject to the rules of the Commission for Mental
19 Health, Developmental Disabilities, and Substance Abuse Services as
20 specified in Article 2 of Chapter 122C of the General Statutes;
21 (5) Persons authorized by statute to receive and place children for foster
22 care and adoption in accordance with G.S. 108A-14;
23 (6) Primarily educational institutions as defined in G.S. 131D-10.2(11); or

1 (7) Individuals who are related by blood, marriage, or adoption to the
2 child."

3 Sec. 2. This act becomes effective January 1, 1995, and applies to licenses
4 required on or after that date.
