S 1 SENATE BILL 1168 Short Title: Unlawful to Remove Collars. (Public) Sponsors: Senator Plexico (By request). Referred to: Judiciary I. May 17, 1993 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT TO MAKE IT UNLAWFUL TO REMOVE OR DESTROY ELECTRONIC COLLARS ON DOGS. The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: Section 1. Article 16 of Chapter 14 of the General Statutes is amended by adding a new section to read: "§ 14-385.1. Removal of electronic collars from dogs. It is unlawful to intentionally remove or destroy an electronic collar or other electronic device placed on a dog by its owner to maintain control of the dog. A violation of this section is a misdemeanor punishable for a first conviction by a fine of up to five hundred dollars (\$500.00), imprisonment for up to 90 days, or both. A second or subsequent conviction for a violation of this section is punishable by a fine of up to one thousand dollars (\$1,000), imprisonment for up to six months, or both." Sec. 2. This act becomes effective December 1, 1993, and applies to offenses
