A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE FUNDS TO FUND FULLY THE EXPANSION OF  
MENTAL HEALTH SERVICES RECOMMENDED BY COALITION 2001.

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

Section 1. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of Human Resources, Division of Mental Health, Developmental Disabilities, and Substance Abuse Services, the sum of nineteen million two hundred ninety-five thousand six hundred sixty-six dollars (\$19,295,666) for the 1994-95 fiscal year to fund fully the expansion of mental health services recommended by Coalition 2001. These funds shall be allocated as follows:

(1) Residential Services:

- a. HUD group homes for MI adults \$413,333
- b. HUD group homes & supported living projects for DD adults 1,170,000
- c. Residential services for DD adults (DDA Group Homes) 226,227
- d. Respite/halfway houses for SA adults 1,600,000

(2) Vocational Services:

- a. ADAP (vocational programs for adults) waiting list reduction \$2,000,000
- b. United Cerebral Palsy day services 400,000

(3) Crisis Emergency Services:

- a. Crisis prevention for high risk

- 1 MI adults \$2,480,000
- 2 b. Crisis management & prevention
- 3 for SA continuum of care 3,909,333
- 4 (4) Child & Youth treatment:
