6 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

Section 1. G.S. 1-538.1 reads as rewritten:

### 8 "§ 1-538.1. Strict liability for damage to person or property by minors.

Any person or other legal entity shall be entitled to recover actual damages suffered 9 in an amount not to exceed a total of one thousand dollars (\$1,000)-three thousand 10 dollars (\$3,000) from the parent or parents of any minor who shall maliciously or 11 willfully injure such person or destroy the real or personal property of such person. 12 Parents whose custody and control have been removed by court order or by contract 13 prior to the act complained of shall not be liable under this act. This act shall not 14 preclude or limit recovery of damages from parents under common law remedies 15 available in this State." 16

17 Sec. 2. This act becomes effective October 1, 1993, and applies to causes of 18 action arising on or after that date.
