1	A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
2	AN ACT TO ESTABLISH STATEWIDE SEASONS FOR TAKING BEAVER AND
3	TO ALLOW THE TAKING OF DEPREDATING BEAVER WITHOUT
4	OBTAINING A PERMIT.
5	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
6	Section 1. G.S. 113-291.9, enacted by Section 3 of Chapter 483 of the 1991
7	Session Laws, reads as rewritten:
8	"§ 113-291.9. Taking of <del>beaver <u>beaver</u>. in certain counties.</del>
9	(a) Notwithstanding any other law, there is an open season for taking beaver with
10	firearms during any open season for the taking of wild animals, provided that
11	permission has been obtained from the owner or lessee of the land on which the beaver
12	is being taken.
13	(b) Notwithstanding any other law, it is lawful to use or sell beaver parts taken
14	under a depredation permit issued by the Wildlife Resources Commission.
15	(c) Notwithstanding G.S. 113-291.6(d) or any other law, it is lawful to set traps
16	number 330 of the connibear type or size, if at least one-half of the trap is covered by
17	water, when trapping beaver during the season for trapping beaver as established by the
18	Wildlife Resources Commission.
19	(d) Notwithstanding G.S. 113-291.1(b)(2) or any other law, it is lawful to use
20	snares when trapping beaver during the season for trapping beaver as established by the
21	Wildlife Resources Commission.
22	(e) <u>Notwithstanding any other provision of law, a landowner whose property is</u>
23	or has been damaged or destroyed by beaver may take beaver on his property by any

- 1 lawful method without obtaining a depredation permit from the Wildlife Resources
- 2 Commission, and may obtain assistance from other persons in taking the depredating
- 3 <u>beaver by giving those persons permission to take beaver on the landowner's property.</u>
- 4 (e) This section applies only to Bladen, Brunswick, Columbus, Craven, Johnston,
- 5 Jones, Lenoir, Pamlico, Randolph, Sampson, and Wayne Counties."
- 6 Sec. 2. This act is effective upon ratification.
