A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT TO AUTHORIZE THE CONTINUATION OF THE EMERGENCY  
2 MANAGEMENT ISSUES STUDY.

4 Whereas, the technical, legal, and economic issues involved in the provision  
5 of emergency response to natural and technological disasters are very complex; and

6 Whereas, the Legislative Research Commission Study Committee on  
7 Emergency Management Issues has met numerous times to discuss the varied issues  
8 before it; and

9 Whereas, a majority of the Committee's time was focused on the development  
10 of a regional response program for hazardous materials emergencies; and

11 Whereas, many of the issues that the Commission was directed to study by  
12 the 1991 General Assembly have not been fully studied and resolved; and

13 Whereas, there is a continuing need to study emergency management issues  
14 and provide for comprehensive disaster planning and a disaster recovery fund; Now,  
15 therefore,

16 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

17 Section 1. The Legislative Research Commission may study the State  
18 emergency management program's ability in the future to adequately address  
19 preparedness, response, recovery, and mitigation for technological and natural hazards  
20 as may impact the citizens of North Carolina and their property. In conducting its  
21 study, the Commission may consider the program's ability in the future to address  
22 recovery operations during Presidential and Gubernatorial declared disasters, including:

- 1           (1)    Need for Disaster Recovery Law, Disaster Recovery Fund, and related  
2                    staffing needs;
- 3           (2)    Need to expand the Emergency Information System; and
- 4           (3)    Need to respond and recover from catastrophic disasters, including  
5                    resource needs at State and local levels such as auxiliary power  
6                    requirements for vital facilities.

7 If the Commission conducts the study authorized under this act, it shall report its  
8 findings together with recommended legislation, to the 1994 Session of the 1993  
9 General Assembly, or to the 1995 General Assembly, or to both.

10           Sec. 2. This resolution is effective upon ratification.
