G.S. 163-247(1) reads as rewritten: 5 Federal Postcard Application Form. - At any time prior to the 6 statewide primary or general election in which he seeks to vote, the 7 applicant may make and sign a written application to the County Board 8 of Election[s] in County of Voter's Residence for absentee ballots on 9 the postcard form specified in or promulgated by regulation under 42 10 U.S.C. 1973cc-14. 42 U.S.C. § 1973ff." 11 Sec. 2. Article 21 of Chapter 163 of the General Statutes is amended by 12 adding a new section to read: 13 "§ 163-251. Electronic facsimile absentee voting. 14 A Federal Postcard Application Form may be sent to a county board of 15 elections under this Article by fax. 16 A ballot under this Article may be returned to the appropriate county board of 17 elections by fax if: 18 19 Both sides of the container return envelope, with the voter's certificate (1) properly executed, are also transmitted by fax; and 20 21 A statement signed by the voter, which states 'I understand that by (2)

faxing my voted ballot I am voluntarily waiving my right to a secret

ballot' is also transmitted by fax.

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- (c) Any documents allowed to be faxed to a county board of elections may also be faxed to a federal officer under the Federal Voting Assistance Program for mailing or retransmitting to the county board of elections, but such document must be received by the county board of elections by the date required by law in order to be valid.
 - (d) As used in this section, a 'fax' is an electronic transmission of a facsimile.
- (e) The State Board of Elections shall issue rules to implement this section."

 Sec. 3. Chapter 163 of the General Statutes is amended by adding a new Article to read:

"ARTICLE 21A.

"FAXING OF OVERSEAS ELECTION MATERIALS.

"§ 163-258. Electronic facsimile absentee voting.

- (a) A Federal Postcard Application Form may be sent by an overseas voter as defined by the Uniformed and Overseas Citizens Absentee Voting Act, 42 U.S.C. § 1973ff et seq. to a county board of elections by fax.
- (b) A ballot for federal office sent by an overseas voter as defined by the Uniformed and Overseas Citizens Absentee Voting Act, 42 U.S.C. § 1973ff et seq. may be returned to the appropriate county board of elections by fax if:
 - (1) Any certification by the voter required by the State Board of Elections in its regulations implementing the Uniformed and Overseas Citizens

 Absentee Voting Act, 42 U.S.C. § 1973ff et seq. is also transmitted by fax; and
 - (2) A statement signed by the voter, which states 'I understand that by faxing my voted ballot I am voluntarily waiving my right to a secret ballot' is also transmitted by fax.
- (c) Any documents allowed to be sent by fax to a county board of elections may also be faxed to a federal officer under the Federal Voting Assistance Program for mailing or retransmitting to the county board of elections, but such document must be received by the county board of elections by the date required by law in order to be valid.
 - (d) As used in this section, a 'fax' is an electronic transmission of a facsimile.
- (e) This section only applies to persons not registered to vote in North Carolina, who are voting a ballot for federal office only as permitted by the Uniformed and Overseas Citizens Absentee Voting Act.
- (f) The State Board of Elections shall issue rules to implement this section."
