A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 2 AN ACT TO DIRECT NORTH CAROLINA STATE UNIVERSITY TO STUDY, 3 THROUGH RESEARCH WITH A HIGH PRIORITY ON FINDING SOLUTIONS 4 FOR, THE ABATEMENT OF ODORS FROM SWINE FARMS AND COMPILE INFORMATION ON THE IMPACT OF SWINE FARMS ON GROUND AND 5 SURFACE WATER SUPPLIES, AND TO PROVIDE FUNDS FOR THE HOUSE 6 AGRICULTURE COMMITTEE AND THE SENATE COMMITTEE 7 ON 8 AGRICULTURE, MARINE RESOURCES, AND WILDLIFE TO HOLD 9 MEETINGS AND TOUR SWINE FARMS IN THE STATE. The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: 10 Section 1. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Board of 11 12 Governors of The University of North Carolina the sum of eighty-five thousand dollars (\$85,000) for fiscal year 1993-94 and the sum of eighty-five thousand dollars (\$85,000) 13 14 for fiscal year 1994-95 to perform a technical study on the cause, extent, and abatement of odors from swine farms and to compile information on the impact of swine farms on 15 ground and surface water supplies. The study shall be conducted by the North Carolina 16 Agricultural Research Service (NCARS) of the College of Agriculture and Life 17 Sciences at North Carolina State University. Reports on the progress of the study shall 18 be presented to the Chair of the House Agriculture Committee, and the Chair of the 19 20 Senate Committee on Agriculture, Marine Resources, and Wildlife, and they shall report 21 to their respective committees biannually. The study shall ascertain: 22 The causes of odors from swine farms; (1)

12	The focus of the above research shall be:	
14	(1)	To offer economically feasible solutions to existing operations for
15	(1)	reduction of odor;
16	(2)	To offer economically feasible solutions that may be incorporated into
17	(-)	new swine operations for reduction of odor;
18	(3)	To review the information available on the impact of swine farms on
19		ground and surface water supplies and propose economically feasible
20		solutions; and
21	(4)	To identify those areas needing further research to insure the
22		availability of economically feasible solutions for odor reduction and
23		wastewater supplies created by swine farms.
24	NCARS shall file its final report and recommendations on or before the convening of	
25	the 1995 General Assembly. The report shall be filed with the offices of the President	
26	Pro Tempore of the Senate, the Speaker of the House of Representatives, the Chair of	
27	the House Agriculture Committee, the Chair of the Senate Committee on Agriculture,	
28	Marine Resources, and Wildlife, the Offices of the Principal Clerks of the Senate and	
29	the House of Representatives, and the Legislative Librarian.	
30	Sec. 2. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the General	
31	Assembly fifteen thousand dollars (\$15,000) for fiscal year 1993-94 and fifteen	
32	thousand dollars (\$15,000) for fiscal year 1994-95 to be used for the House Agriculture	
33	Committee and the Senate Committee on Agriculture, Marine Resources, and Wildlife	
34	to hold meetings and tour swine farms in the State for evaluating information on the	
35	issues of odors and wastewater supplies from swine farms. The Chairs of both	
36	Committees will be responsible for calling the meetings and tours as they deem	
37	necessary.
