A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT TO REPEAL THE PROVISION IN THE STRUCTURED SENTENCING
ACT THAT WOULD HAVE PROVIDED THAT POSSESSION OF LESS THAN

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
Section 1. Section 1358.1 of Chapter 539 of the 1993 Session Laws is repealed.

Sec. 2. This Part is effective upon ratification.
