February 6, 1995 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT TO PROVIDE THAT HIGH SCHOOL AGE CHILDREN WHO DO NOT ATTEND SCHOOL SHALL NOT BE ELIGIBLE FOR DRIVERS LICENSES. The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: Section 1. G.S. 20-9 is amended by adding a new subsection to read: The Division shall not issue a license to a person who is under 18 years of age and who is not enrolled in a public or private school and Is not a high school graduate, (1) Is not enrolled full time in a vocational course of study at an institution (2) within the community college system, or Has not successfully completed a vocational course of study at an (3) institution within the community college system. The superintendent of each local school administrative unit shall notify the Division, as provided in G.S. 115C-276(r), of any student between the ages of 15 and 18 who drops out of school." Sec. 2. G.S. 20-16(a) is amended by adding a new subdivision to read: "(12) Is under 18 years of age and who is not enrolled in a public or private school and Is not a high school graduate, a.

11	notify the Division of Motor Vehicles immediately of all students between the ages of 15
12	and 18 who drop out of school. For purposes of this subsection, a student shall be
13	deemed to have dropped out of school when he has nine or more unexcused absences in
14	the preceding semester. Any absences due to suspension shall be unexcused absences."
15	Sec. 4. Sections 1 and 2 of this act become effective July 1, 1995. Sections 3
16	and 4 of this act are effective upon ratification.
