2	AN ACT TO PROVIDE QUALIFIED IMMUNITY TO PROFESSIONAL ENGINEERS
3	WHO VOLUNTARILY PROVIDE ENGINEERING SERVICES DURING AN
4	EMERGENCY WITHOUT COMPENSATION.
5	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
6	Section 1. Chapter 89C of the General Statutes is amended by adding a new
7	section to read:
8	" <u>§ 89C-19.1. Engineer who volunteers during an emergency; qualified immunity.</u>
9	(a) A professional engineer who voluntarily, without compensation, provides
10	structural, electrical, mechanical, or other engineering services at the scene of a declared
11	emergency, whether national, State, or local, arising from a major earthquake, hurricane,
12	tornado, fire, explosion, collapse, or other similar disaster or catastrophic event, at the
13	request of a public official, law enforcement official, public safety official, or building
14	inspection official, acting in an official capacity, shall not be liable for any personal
15	injury, wrongful death, property damage, or other loss caused by the professional
16	engineer's acts or omissions in the performance of the engineering services.
17	(b) The immunity provided in subsection (a) of this section applies only to an
18	engineering service:
19	(1) For any structure, building, piping, or other engineered system, either
20	publicly or privately owned.

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1	(2)	That occurs within 15 days after the deeleration of the emergency	
-	<u>(2)</u>	That occurs within 45 days after the declaration of the emergency,	
2		disaster, or catastrophic event, unless the 45-day immunity period is	
3		extended by an executive order issued by the Governor under the	
4		Governor's emergency executive powers.	
5		ne immunity provided in subsection (a) of this section does not apply if it	
6	is determined th	at the personal injury, wrongful death, property damage, or other loss was	
7	caused by the	gross negligence, wanton conduct, or intentional wrongdoing of the	
8	•	gineer, or while the professional engineer was operating or responsible for	
9	the operation of a motor vehicle.		
10	(d) <u>As</u>	s used in this section:	
11	<u>(1)</u>	'Building inspection official' means any appointed or elected federal,	
12		State, or local official with overall executive responsibility to coordinate	
13		building inspection in the jurisdiction in which the emergency, disaster,	
14		or catastrophic event has occurred.	
15	<u>(2)</u>	'Law enforcement official' means any appointed or elected federal,	
16		State, or local official with overall executive responsibility to coordinate	
17		law enforcement in the jurisdiction in which the emergency, disaster, or	
18		catastrophic event has occurred.	
19	<u>(3)</u>	'Public official' means any federal, State, or locally elected official with	
20		overall executive responsibility in the jurisdiction in which the	
21		emergency, disaster, or catastrophic event has occurred.	
22	<u>(4)</u>	'Public safety official' means any appointed or elected federal, State, or	
23		local official with overall executive responsibility to coordinate public	
24		safety in the jurisdiction in which the emergency, disaster, or	
25		catastrophic event has occurred."	
26	Sec. 2	2. This act is effective upon ratification and applies to any cause of action	
27	that arises on or after that date.		

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
