1	A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
2	AN ACT TO REAUTHORIZE THE MENTAL HEALTH STUDY COMMISSION.
3	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
4	Section 1. The Mental Health Study Commission, established and structured
5	by 1973 General Assembly Resolution 80; Chapter 806, 1973 Session Laws; Chapter
6	185, 1975 Session Laws; Chapter 184, 1977 Session Laws; Chapter 215, 1979 Session
7	Laws; 1979 General Assembly Resolution 20; Chapter 49, 1981 Session Laws; Chapter
8	268, 1983 Session Laws; Chapter 792, 1985 Session Laws; Chapter 873, 1987 Session
9	Laws; Chapter 802, 1989 Session Laws; Chapter 754, 1991 Session Laws; and Chapter
10	771, 1993 Session Laws, Regular Session 1994, is reestablished and authorized to
11	continue in existence until July 1, 1997.
12	Sec. 2. (a) The Commission shall consist of 25 members as follows:
13	(1) The Secretary of the Department of Human Resources or a delegate,
14	serving ex officio as a nonvoting member;
15	(2) Eight members appointed by the Speaker of the House of
16	Representatives, seven of whom shall be members of the House of
17	Representatives at the time of their appointment. One of these seven

1		shall be a Chair of the House Appropriations Subcommittee on Human
2		Resources, and one shall be a Chair of a standing House committee that
3		deals with mental health, developmental disabilities, and substance
4		abuse issues;
5	(3)	Eight members appointed by the President Pro Tempore of the Senate,
6		seven of whom shall be members of the Senate at the time of their
7		appointment. One of these seven shall be Chair of the Senate Human
8		Resources Appropriations Committee and one shall be Chair of a
9		standing Senate committee that deals with mental health, developmental
10		disabilities, and substance abuse issues; and
11	(4)	Eight members appointed by the Governor, two of whom shall be
12		county commissioners at the time of their appointment, taken from a list
13		of four candidates nominated by the North Carolina Association of
14		County Commissioners. If the Association has failed to make
15		nominations by September 1, 1995, the Governor may appoint any two
16		county commissioners.
17	(b) M	embers and staff of the continued Mental Health Study Commission shall
18	receive compen	sation and expenses delineated by the original authorization in the 1973
19	General Assemb	bly Resolution 80. Expenses of the Commission shall be expended by the
20		Iuman Resources from Budget Code 14460 subhead 1110.
21	Sec. 3	3. The continued Mental Health Study Commission has all the powers
22	and duties of th	ne original Commission as they are necessary to continue the original
23	study, to assist	in the implementation of the original and succeeding Commission
24	recommendation	ns, and to plan future activity on the subject of the study. In addition to
25	other studies aut	horized by law, the Commission shall:
26	(1)	Conduct research and develop recommendations regarding the response
27		of the public system to the changing health care environment which
28		recommendations shall include recommendations on issues of
29		governance, accountability, date collection, and collaboration between
30		public and private sectors;
31	(2)	Analyze and develop recommendations regarding the current system of
32		funding services to evaluate maximum use of funds;
33	(3)	Oversee the Mental Health Study Commission ten-year Disability Plan
34		that has been endorsed by the General Assembly;
35	(4)	Evaluate quality improvement initiatives and develop recommendations
36		regarding accountability, performance standards, and client outcomes;
37	(5)	Monitor and evaluate the new initiatives, including crisis services,
38		Carolina Alternatives, and domiciliary care, developed by the Division
39		of Mental Health, Developmental Disabilities, and Substance Abuse
40		Services, to consider whether to recommend their possible expansion;
41	(6)	Review major initiatives for children for integration with the Child
42		Mental Health Plan;

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1	(7) Develop a business initiative to increase public/private partnerships to
2	enhance current services for those individuals with mental illness,
3	developmental disabilities, and substance abuse problems; and
4	(8) Carry out any other evaluations the Commission considers necessary to
5	perform its mandate.
6	Sec. 4. The Mental Health Study Commission shall make a report to the 1997
7	General Assembly, including any legislative proposals, by March 15, 1997.
8	Sec. 5. This act becomes effective July 1, 1995.
