Section 1. Article 2 of Chapter 20 of the General Statutes is amended by adding a new section to read:

"§ 20-9.1. Medical care providers providing medical information on drivers with physical or mental disabilities.

- (a) Notwithstanding any other law relating to confidentiality of communications with any medical care provider, any medical care provider in North Carolina may disclose to the Commissioner information about a patient who has a mental or physical disability that the medical care provider believes may affect the patient's ability to safely operate a motor vehicle. This information shall be limited to the patient's name, address, and diagnosis.
- (b) The information provided to the Commissioner pursuant to this section shall be confidential and shall be used only for the purpose of determining the qualifications of the patient to operate a motor vehicle.
- (c) A medical care provider disclosing information pursuant to this section is immune from any civil or criminal liability that might otherwise be incurred or imposed

- (d) For purposes of this section, 'medical care provider' includes licensed physicians, dentists, optometrists, osteopathic physicians, podiatrists, certified clinical social workers, chiropractors, psychologists, and advanced practice registered nurses."
