Referred to: Judiciary II/Election Laws March 6, 1995 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT TO REDUCE THE COST OF PROVIDING INDIGENT REPRESENTATION IN CRIMINAL CASES BY AUTHORIZING THE ADMINISTRATIVE OFFICER OF THE COURTS TO CONTRACT WITH A PARTICULAR ATTORNEY OR ATTORNEYS TO PROVIDE SPECIALIZED SERVICES ON A FULL-TIME BASIS IN CAPITAL INDIGENT CASES. The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: Section 1. G.S. 7A-344 reads as rewritten: "§ 7A-344. Special duties of Director concerning representation of indigent persons. In addition to the duties prescribed in G.S. 7A-343, the Director shall also: Supervise and coordinate the operation of the laws and regulations (1) concerning the assignment of legal counsel for indigent persons under Subchapter IX of this Chapter to the end that all indigent persons are adequately represented; Advise and cooperate with the offices of the public defenders as needed (2) to achieve maximum effectiveness in the discharge of the defender's responsibilities; Collect data on the operation of the assigned counsel and the public (3) defender systems, and make such recommendations to the General

Assembly for improvement in the operation of these systems as appear to him to be appropriate; and

- (4) Accept and utilize federal or private funds, as available, to improve defense services for the indigent, including juveniles alleged to be delinquent or undisciplined. To facilitate processing of juvenile cases and capital indigent cases, and civil cases in which a party is entitled to counsel, the administrative officer is further authorized, in any district or set of districts as defined in G.S. 7A-41.1(a), with the approval of the chief district court judge for cases in the district court division and the approval of the senior resident superior court judge for cases in the superior court division, to engage the services of a particular attorney or attorneys to provide specialized representation on a full-time or part-time basis."
- Sec. 2. This act is effective upon ratification.
