BILL SUMMARY: AGRICULTURAL OPERATION IN VIOLATION. TO PROVIDE THAT AN AGRICULTURAL OPERATION THAT IS OPERATED IN CONTINUED VIOLATION OF APPLICABLE ENVIRONMENTAL STATE STATUTES OR RULES ADOPTED PURSUANT TO THOSE STATUTES CONSTITUTES A NUISANCE AND TO PROVIDE THAT THE OWNER AND OPERATOR OF SUCH AN AGRICULTURAL OPERATION AND THE OWNER OF ANY LIVESTOCK OR POULTRY RAISED OR PRODUCED AT SUCH OPERATION MAY BE JOINTLY AND SEVERALLY LIABLE FOR RESULTING DAMAGES. Amends GS 106-701 as title indicates. Provides that operation is nuisance if no action is taken to correct violation within 30 days after final agency decision or court order served on violator. Limits aggregate damages, to any person harmed as result of operation, to \$250,000.
