2 AN ACT TO ALLOW TOWN MANAGERS OF SMALL TOWNS TO HOLD 3 CONCURRENTLY APPOINTIVE AND MUNICIPAL ELECTIVE OFFICES 4 UNDER CERTAIN CIRCUMSTANCES. 5 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: Section 1. G.S. 160A-147 reads as rewritten: 6 7 "§ 160A-147. Appointment of city manager; dual office holding. In cities whose charters provide for the council-manager form of government, 8 (a) the council shall appoint a city manager to serve at its pleasure. The manager shall be 9 appointed solely on the basis of his-the manager's executive and administrative 10 qualifications. He-The manager need not be a resident of the city or State at the time of 11 his-appointment. The office of city manager is hereby declared to be an office that may 12 be held concurrently with other appointive (but not elective) offices pursuant to Article 13 14 VI, Sec. 9, of the Constitution. Notwithstanding the provisions of subsection (a), a city manager may serve on 15 (b)a county board of education which that is elected on a non-partisan basis if the following 16 17 criteria are met: 18 (1) The population of the city by which the city manager is employed does 19 not exceed 10,000;
