A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT TO PLACE ON THE SCHEDULE II CONTROLLED SUBSTANCES LIST
THE DRUG REMIFENTANIL AND SALTS THEREOF, IN ACCORDANCE
WITH FEDERAL LAW.

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

Section 1. G.S. 90-90(b) reads as rewritten:

"(b) Any of the following opiates, including their isomers, esters, ethers, salts, and salts of isomers, whenever the existence of such isomers, esters, ethers, and salts is possible within the specific chemical designation unless specifically exempted or listed in other schedules:

01. Alfentanil.
1. Alphaprodine.
2. Anileridine.
3. Bezitramide.
- 3a. Carfentanil.
4. Dihydrocodeine.
5. Diphenoxylate.
6. Fentanyl.
7. Isomethadone.

- 1 7a. Levo-alphaacetylmethadol. Some trade or other names: levo-alpha-
2 acetylmethadol, levomethadyl acetate, or LAAM.
3 8. Levomethorphan.
4 9. Levorphanol.
5 10. Metazocine.
6 11. Methadone.
