**BILL SUMMARY**: The bill allows Charlotte to retain possession of towed vehicles until the owner pays the towing fee and overdue tickets or post a bond. An individual still has the right to contest the towing or any related parking tickets.

**ASSUMPTIONS AND METHODOLOGY:** Over the last two years, the City of Charlotte has amassed \$500,000 in uncollectable towing and storage fees. Persons now pay their ticket and retrieve their vehicle without paying these fees. A spokesman for the Charlotte Transportation Department believes the bill will enable to city to collect \$250,000 in revenue each year.
