2	AN ACT TO ENHANCE THE AUTHORITY OF THE SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT
3	TEAM WITH REGARD TO THE SCHOOL CALENDAR.
4	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
5	Section 1. G.S. 115C-84.2(a) reads as rewritten:
6	"(a) School Calendar. – Each local board of education shall adopt a school calendar
7	consisting of 220 days all of which shall fall within the fiscal year. A school calendar
8	shall include the following:
9	(1) A minimum of 180 days and 1,000 hours of instruction covering at least
10	nine calendar months. The local board shall designate when the 180
11	instructional days shall occur. The number of instructional hours in an
12	instructional day may vary according to local board policy and does not
13	have to be uniform among the schools in the administrative unit. Local
14	boards may approve school improvement plans that include days with
15	varying amounts of instructional time. If school is closed early due to
16	inclement weather, the day and the scheduled amount of instructional
17	hours may count towards the required minimum to the extent allowed
18	by State Board policy. The school calendar shall include a plan for
19	making up days and instructional hours missed when schools are not
20	opened due to inclement weather.

1	(2)	A minimum of 10 annual vacation leave days.	
2	(3)	The same or an equivalent number of legal holidays occurring within	
3		the school calendar as those designated by the State Personnel	
4		Commission for State employees.	
5	(4)	Ten-Five days, as designated by the local board, for use as teacher	
6		workdays, additional instructional days, or other lawful purposes. A	
7		local board may delegate to the individual schools some or all of the 10	
8		five days to schedule under subdivision (5) of this subsection. A local	
9		board may schedule different purposes for different personnel on any	
10		given day and is not required to schedule the same dates for all	
11		personnel.	
12	(5)	The remaining days shall be scheduled by each individual school by the	
13		school's principal in consultation with the school improvement teamschool	
14		improvement team in consultation with the principal. Days may be	
15		scheduled for any of the purposes allowed under subdivision (4) of this	
16		subsection. Days may be scheduled for different purposes for different	
17		personnel and there is no requirement to schedule the same dates for all	
18		personnel.	
19	Local boards and individual schools are encouraged to use the calendar flexibility in		
20	order to meet the annual performance standards set by the State Board. Local boards of		
21	education shall consult with parents and the employed public school personnel in the		
22	development of the school calendar.		
23	Local boards and individual schools shall give teachers at least 14 calendar days'		
24	notice before requiring a teacher to work instead of taking vacation leave on days		
25	scheduled in accordance with subdivision (4) or (5) of this subsection. A teacher may
