1 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 2 AN ACT TO REPEAL THE ANNUAL TRANSFER OF

AN ACT TO REPEAL THE ANNUAL TRANSFER OF ONE HUNDRED SEVENTY MILLION DOLLARS IN HIGHWAY USE TAX COLLECTIONS FROM THE HIGHWAY TRUST FUND TO THE GENERAL FUND AND TO PROVIDE THAT THOSE FUNDS SHALL BE USED BY THE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION FOR HIGHWAY MAINTENANCE.

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

Section 1. G.S. 105-187.9 reads as rewritten:

"§ 105-187.9. Disposition of tax proceeds.

Taxes collected under this Article at the rate of eight percent (8%) shall be credited to the General Fund. Taxes collected under this Article at the rate of three percent (3%) shall be credited to the North Carolina Highway Trust Fund. In each fiscal year the State Treasurer shall transfer the sum of one hundred seventy million dollars (\$170,000,000) of the taxes deposited in the Trust Fund to the General Fund. The transfer of funds authorized by this section may be made by transferring one fourth of the amount at the end of each quarter in the fiscal year or by transferring the full amount annually on July 1 of each fiscal year, subject to the availability of revenue."

Section 2. G.S. 136-176 is amended by adding a new subsection to read:

1	"(e) The Department of Transportation shall annually use one hundred seventy
2	million dollars (\$170,000,000) of the funds deposited in the Trust Fund pursuant to
3	subdivision (a)(2) of this section for highway maintenance purposes."
4	Section 3. This act is effective when it becomes law.
