3	UNIVERSITY HEALTH SYSTEMS OF EASTERN CAROLINA SPECIAL
4	REGISTRATION PLATES AND TO MODIFY THE SPECIAL REGISTRATION
5	PLATES ISSUED TO MEMBERS OF THE JUDICIARY.
6	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
7	Section 1. G.S. 20-79.4(b) reads as rewritten:
8	"(b) Types. – The Division shall issue the following types of special registration
9	plates:

11	(48a) University Health Systems of Eastern Carolina. – Issuable to the
12	registered owner of a motor vehicle in accordance with G.S. 20-
13	81.12. The plate may bear a phrase or insignia representing the
14	University Health Systems of Eastern Carolina.

16	Section 2. G.S. 20-79.7(a) reads as rewritten:
17	"(a) Fees. – Upon request, the Division shall provide and issue free of charge one
18	registration plate to a recipient of the Congressional Medal of Honor, a 100% disabled

1	Section 4. G.S. 20-81.12 is amended by adding a new subsection to read:
2	"( <u>b10</u> ) University Health Systems of Eastern Carolina. – The Division must
3	receive 300 or more applications for a University Health Systems of Eastern Carolina
4	plate before the plate may be developed. The Division shall transfer quarterly the money
5	in the Collegiate and Cultural Attraction Plate Account derived from the sale of
6	University Health Systems of Eastern Carolina plates to the Pitt Memorial Hospital
7	Foundation, Inc., for use in the Children's Hospital of Eastern North Carolina."
8	Section 5. G.S. 20-79.6 reads as rewritten:
9	"§ 20-79.6. Special registration plates for members of the judiciary.
10	(a) Appellate Division.Supreme Court. – A special plate issued to a Justice or
11	Judge of the North Carolina Appellate Courts shall bear the letter "J" followed by a
12	number from 1 through 19. of the North Carolina Supreme Court shall bear the words
13	'Supreme Court' and the Great Seal of North Carolina and a number from 1 through 7.
14	The Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of North Carolina shall be issued the plate
15	bearing the number 1 and the remaining plates shall be issued to the Associate Justices on
16	the basis of seniority.
17	Special plates issued to retired members of the Supreme Court shall bear a number
18	indicating the member's position of seniority at the time of retirement followed by the
19	letter 'X' to indicate the member's retired status.
20	(a1) Court of Appeals. – A special plate issued to a Judge of the North Carolina
21	Court of Appeals shall bear the words 'Court of Appeals' and the Great Seal of North
22	Carolina and a number beginning with the number 1. The Chief Judge of the North
23	Carolina Court of Appeals shall be issued the next judicial plate a plate with the number 1
24	and the remaining plates shall be issued to the Associate Judges with the numbers
25	assigned on the basis of seniority.
26	Special plates issued to retired members of the Supreme Court and the Court of Appeals
27	shall bear a number indicating the member's position of seniority at the time of retirement
28	followed by the letter 'X' to indicate the member's retired status.
29	(b) Superior Court. – A special plate issued to a resident superior court judge shall
30	bear the letter 'J' followed by a number indicative of the judicial district the judge serves.
31	The number issued to the senior resident superior court judge shall be equal to the sum of
32	the numerical designation of the judge's judicial district, as defined in $G.S. 7A-41.1(a)(1)$ ,
33	plus 20. <u>G.S. 7A-41.1(a)(1)</u> . If a district has more than one regular resident superior
34	court judge, a special plate for a resident superior court judge of that district shall bear the
35	number issued to the senior resident superior court judge followed by a hyphen and a letter of the alphabet beginning with the letter 'A' to indicate the judge's seniority.

The letter assigned to a resident superior 1 2 court judge will not necessarily correspond with the letter designation of the district the 3 judge serves. For the set of districts 7B and 7C, the senior resident superior court judge for that 4 set shall be issued a special plate bearing the designation 27C following the letter "J", and all 5 other resident superior court judges of the set shall be issued a special plate bearing that 6 designation followed by the letter "B". 7 Where there are two or more regular resident superior court judges for the district or 8 set of districts, the registration plate with the letter 'A' shall be issued to the judge who, 9 from among all the regular resident superior court judges of the district or set of districts, 10 has the most continuous service as a regular resident superior court judge; provided if two 11 or more judges are of equal service, the oldest of those judges shall receive the next letter

12 registration plate. Thereafter, registration plates shall be issued based on seniority within 13 the district or set of districts.

A special judge, emergency judge, or retired judge of the superior court shall be issued a special plate bearing the letter 'J' followed by a number designated by the Administrative Office of the Courts with the approval of the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of North Carolina. The plate for a retired judge shall have the letter 'X' after the designated number to indicate the judge's retired status.

19 (c)District Court. – A special plate issued to a North Carolina district court judge 20 shall bear the letter 'J' followed by a number. For the chief judge of the district court district, the number shall be equal to the sum of the numerical designation of the district 21 22 court district the chief judge serves, plus 100. The number for all other judges of the 23 district courts serving within the same district court district shall be the same number as 24 appears on the special plate issued to the chief district judge followed by a letter of the alphabet beginning with the letter 'A' to indicate the judge's seniority. A retired district 25 26 court judge shall be issued a similar plate except that the numerical designation shall be followed by the letter 'X' to indicate the judge's retired status. 27

28 United States. - A special plate issued to a Justice of the United States (d)29 Supreme Court, a Judge of the United States Circuit Court of Appeals, or a District Judge 30 of the United States District Court residing in North Carolina shall bear the words 'U.S. J' followed by a number beginning with '1'. The number shall reflect the judge's seniority 31 32 based on continuous service as a United States Judge as designated by the Secretary of State. A judge who has retired or taken senior status shall be issued a similar plate except 33 34 that the number shall be based on the date of the judge's retirement or assumption of 35 senior status and shall follow the numerical designation of active justices and judges." 36 Section 6. This act is effective when it becomes law.
