- 2 AN ACT TO PROHIBIT THE MISUSE OF LASER DEVICES.
- 3 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
 - Section 1. Article 8 of Chapter 14 of the General Statutes is amended by adding a new section to read:

"§ 14-34.8. Criminal use of laser device.

- (a) For purposes of this section, the term 'laser' means light amplification by stimulated emission of radiation.
- (b) It is unlawful intentionally to point a laser device at another person while the device is emitting a laser beam.
 - (c) A violation of this section is a Class 1 misdemeanor.
- 12 (d) This section does not apply to a law enforcement officer who uses a laser
 13 device in discharging or attempting to discharge the officer's official duties. This section
 14 does not apply to a person who is licensed or otherwise authorized by law to use a laser
 15 device in the person's profession if the laser device is used by the person in discharging
 16 or attempting to discharge the person's official duties.
 - (e) This section does not apply to laser tag and similar games and devices using light emitting diode (LED) technology."

Section 2. This act becomes effective December 1, 1999, and applies to offenses committed on or after that date.
