AN ACT TO PROHIBIT THE MISUSE OF LASER DEVICES.

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

Section 1. Article 8 of Chapter 14 of the General Statutes is amended by adding a new section to read:

"§ 14-34.8. Criminal use of laser device.

- For purposes of this section, the term 'laser' means light amplification by stimulated emission of radiation.
- It is unlawful intentionally to point a laser device at a law enforcement officer, or at the head or face of another person, while the device is emitting a laser beam.
 - A violation of this section is a Class 1 misdemeanor.
- This section does not apply to a law enforcement officer who uses a laser (d) device in discharging or attempting to discharge the officer's official duties. This section does not apply to a health care professional who uses a laser device in providing services within the scope of practice of that professional nor to any other person who is licensed or authorized by law to use a laser device and uses it in the performance of the person's official duties.

- This section does not apply to laser tag and similar games and devices using 1 light emitting diode (LED) technology."
 - Section 2. This act becomes effective December 1, 1999, and applies to offenses committed on or after that date.
