**BILL SUMMARY**: S 759. SEXUAL PRIVACY ACT. RELATING TO CRIMINAL PENALTIES FOR PRIVATE SEXUAL ACTIVITY BETWEEN CONSENTING ADULTS. Amends GS 14-177, which makes the act of crime against nature a Class I felony, to provide the act is <u>not</u> a crime if it occurs between consenting adults in privacy and not for hire. (Institute of Government <u>Daily Bulletin</u> April 5, 1999)

## **ASSUMPTIONS AND METHODOLOGY:**

This Bill <u>narrows</u> the scope of the existing crime against nature law so has the potential to <u>decrease</u> inmates in prison or jail. In 1997-98 there were 56 convictions and 3 active sentences for crime against nature or attempted crime against nature. It is not known whether any of these cases occurred between consenting adults in private and not for hire. If many of them fall in this category, SB 759 has the potential to slightly decrease the inmate population. This would not have a significant impact on resources of the Department of Correction.

There may also be a slight effect on the workload in the Judicial Branch. The law may result in fewer prosecutions and fewer hours spent by Assistant DA's, Judges and Clerks. However, there may be in some instances more time spent in handling cases if the issue of "consenting adult" is contested. In either case the effect would not significantly effect the Judicial Branch.
