A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT TO REPEAL LANGUAGE EXCLUDING CERTAIN RETIRED LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS FROM THE REEXAMINATION REQUIREMENT FOR DISABILITY RETIREMENT BENEFITS.

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

SECTION 1. G.S. 128-27(e)(1) reads as rewritten:

The Board of Trustees shall determine whether a disability beneficiary 7 is engaged in or is able to engage in a gainful occupation paying more 8 than the difference, as hereinafter indexed, between his disability 9 10 retirement allowance and the gross compensation earned as an employee during the 12 consecutive months in the final 48 months of 11 service prior to retirement producing the highest gross compensation 12 excluding any compensation received on account of termination. If the 13 disability beneficiary is earning or is able to earn more than the 14 difference, the portion of his disability retirement allowance not 15 provided by his contributions shall be reduced to an amount which, 16 together with the portion of the disability retirement allowance 17 provided by his contributions and the amount earnable by him shall 18 equal the amount of his gross compensation prior to retirement. This 19 difference shall be increased on January 1 each year by the ratio of the 20 Consumer Price Index to the Index one year earlier, calculated to the 21 nearest tenth of a percent (1/10 of 1%). Should the earning capacity of 22 the disability beneficiary later change, the portion of his disability 23 24 retirement allowance not provided by his contributions may be further modified. In lieu of the reductions on account of a disability 25 beneficiary earning more than the aforesaid difference, he may elect to 26 convert his disability retirement allowance to a service retirement 27 allowance calculated on the basis of his average final compensation 28 and creditable service at the time of disability retirement and his age at 29

L	the time of conversion to service retirement. This election is
2	irrevocable.
3	The provisions of this subdivision shall not apply to beneficiaries
1	of the Law Enforcement Officers' Retirement System transferred to
5	this Retirement System who commenced retirement on and before July
5	1, 1981. "
7	SECTION 2. This act is effective when it becomes law.
