G.S. 20-79.4(b)(36b) reads as rewritten: Types. - The Division shall issue the following types of special registration 10 "(b) 11 plates: 12 13 (36b) Rocky Mountain Elk Foundation. – Issuable to the registered owner of 14 a motor vehicle in accordance with G.S. 20-81.12. The plate shall bear 15 the phrase "Rocky Mountain Elk Foundation" and a replica of the 16 "Walking Bull" logo of the Rocky Mountain Elk Foundation, Inc. The 17 Division shall not develop this plate unless the approved by the Rocky 18 Mountain Elk Foundation, Inc. licenses, without charge, the State to 19 use the "Walking Bull" logo on the plate." 20 21 **SECTION 3.** G.S. 20-79.4(b)(3c) is recodified as G.S. 20-79.4(b)(3d) and G.S. 20-79.4(b)(45b) is recodified as G.S. 20-79.4(b)(45c). 22 23 SECTION 4. G.S. 20-79.4(b) is amended by adding two new subdivisions to 24 read: 25 Types. - The Division shall issue the following types of special registration "(b) 26 plates: 27 . . . 28 (3c) Aviation Maintenance Technician. - Issuable to a person who is a 29 Federal Aviation Authority certified Aviation Maintenance Technician. The plate shall bear the logo of the F.A.A. Airworthiness 30 Program and the initials "A.M.T." The Division may not issue the 31 plate authorized by this subdivision unless it receives at least 300 32 applications for the plate. 33 34 35 (45b) Sweet Potato. – Issuable to the registered owner of a motor vehicle. The plate may bear a phrase and picture representing the State's 36 official vegetable, the sweet potato. The Division may not issue the 37 plate authorized by this subdivision unless it receives at least 300 38 39 applications for the plate. 40 **SECTION 5.** This act is effective when it becomes law. 41
