The hospital shall report the data collected for the immediately preceding 90-day period to the State Center for Health Statistics. Data shall be reported in aggregate form and shall not identify individuals who are the subject of the data.

SECTION 2. Article 15 of Chapter 130A of the General Statutes is amended by adding the following new section to read:

"§ 130A-375. Analysis of data submitted by hospitals on respiratory ailments or distress.

- (a) The State Center for Health Statistics shall receive and analyze data reported from hospitals pursuant to G.S. 131E-79.2 to determine whether correlations exist between environmental conditions and respiratory ailments. The Department of Environment and Natural Resources shall provide the State Center for Health Statistics with air quality or other data that will assist the Center in its analysis of the data reported by hospitals under G.S. 131E-79.2.
- (b) The State Center for Health Statistics shall report its findings annually to the Secretary of Health and Human Services, the Governor, and the Joint Legislative Health Care Oversight Committee. The report may include recommendations to the Committee for action by the General Assembly to address public health problems identified from its analysis under this section.
- (c) The Commission for Health Services may adopt rules pertaining to the reporting, collection, and analysis of data required under this section and G.S. 131E-79.2."
- **SECTION 3.** The Commission for Health Services may adopt temporary rules in accordance with Chapter 150B of the General Statutes to implement this act.
- **SECTION 4.** This act becomes effective October 1, 2001.
