A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT TO REPEAL ARTICLE 6 OF THE UNIFORM COMMERCIAL CODE RELATING TO BULK TRANSFERS AND TO ENACT CONFORMING AMENDMENTS TO THE UNIFORM COMMERCIAL CODE AND OTHER SECTIONS OF THE GENERAL STATUTES.

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

SECTION 1. Article 6 of Chapter 25 of the General Statutes is repealed.

SECTION 2. G.S. 25-1-105(2), as amended by S.L. 2000-169, reads as rewritten:

- Where one of the following provisions of this Chapter specifies the applicable "(2)law, that provision governs and a contrary agreement is effective only to the extent permitted by the law (including the conflict of laws rules) so specified:
- Rights of creditors against sold goods. (G.S. 25-2-402).
- Applicability of the article on bank deposits and collections. (G.S. 25-4-102). 14
- Governing law in the article on Funds Transfers. (G.S. 25-4A-507). 15
- Letters of Credit. (G.S. 25-5-116). 16 17
