5			<b>FION 1.</b> G.S. 90D-5(b) reads as rewritten:		
6	"(b)	Comp	position and Terms The Board shall consist of nine members who		
7	shall ser	ve stag	gered terms. The initial Board members shall be selected on or before		
8	8 January 1, 2003, July 1, 2003, as follows:				
9		(1)	A member of the North Carolina Association of the Deaf (NCAD) who		
10			is deaf and familiar with the interpreting process. This member shall		
11			be appointed by the Governor and serve for a term of two years.		
12		(2)	An interpreter who is a member of the North Carolina Registry of		
13			Interpreters for the Deaf, Inc., (NCRID) with five years experience in a		
14			community setting and who is licensed to practice as an interpreter or		
15			transliterator under this Chapter. This member shall be appointed by		
16			the Governor and serve for a term of three years.		
17		(3)	An employee of the North Carolina Department of Health and Human		
18			Services. This member shall be appointed by the Governor, upon		
19			recommendation of the Secretary of the Department, and serve a term		
20			of three years.		
21		(4)	An interpreter or transliterator for deaf-blind individuals who is		
22			licensed to practice as an interpreter or transliterator under this Chapter		
23			or a deaf-blind individual who is a member of the North Carolina		
24			Deaf-Blind Association and who has knowledge of the interpreting		
25			process. This member shall be appointed by the General Assembly,		
26			upon recommendation of the President Pro Tempore of the Senate, and		
27		<i>.</i>	serve for a term of three years.		
28		(5)	A cued speech or oral transliterator licensed to practice as an		
29			interpreter or transliterator under this Chapter. This member shall be		

1 2		appointed by the General Assembly, upon recommendation of the President Pro Tempore of the Senate, and serve for a term of two
3		years.
4	(6)	A member of Self Help for Hard of Hearing (SHHH) with knowledge
5	(0)	of the interpreting process and deafness. This member shall be
6		appointed by the General Assembly, upon recommendation of the
7		President Pro Tempore of the Senate, and serve for a term of three
8		years.
9	(7)	An interpreter who is a member of the North Carolina Registry of
10		Interpreters for the Deaf, Inc., (NCRID) with five years experience in
11		an educational setting in grades K-12 and who is licensed to practice
12		as an interpreter or transliterator under this Chapter. This member shall
13		be appointed by the General Assembly, upon recommendation of the
14		Speaker of the House of Representatives, and serve for a term of two
15		years.
16	(8)	A faculty member of an Interpreter Training Program (ITP), an
17		Interpreter Preparation Program (IPP), or a qualified or professional
18		certified instructor of the American Sign Language Teachers
19		Association (ASLTA). This member shall be appointed by the General
20		Assembly, upon recommendation of the Speaker of the House of
21		Representatives, and serve for a term of two years.
22	(9)	A public member. This member shall be appointed by the General
23		Assembly, upon recommendation of the Speaker of the House of
24		Representatives, and serve a term of two years. For purposes of this
25		section, a public member shall not be licensed under this Chapter or
26		have an immediate family member who is deaf or hard-of-hearing.

30		<b>FION 2.</b> Section 7 of S.L. 2002-182 reads as rewritten:
31		7. A person practicing interpreter or transliterator services on the

36	(1)	Evidence that the person meets the qualifications in subdivisions $(a)(1)$
37		and (a)(2) of G.S. 90D-7.
38	(2)	Evidence that the person has been actively engaged as an interpreter or
39		transliterator in this State for at least 200 hours for each of the two
40		years immediately preceding the effective date of this act. The
41		evidence must be verified in writing by sources approved by the
42		Board.
43	(3)	Two letters of recommendation from sources approved by the Board.

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A fee of seventy-five dollars (\$75.00) for the registration. This fee (4) 1 2 shall be in lieu of the fee for a license authorized in G.S. 90D-10 of the 3 act. 4 A person who obtains a license by meeting the requirements of this section must comply with the continuing education requirements set by the Board. Any practicing person 5 6 who does not register with the Board within 18 months of the effective date of this act 7 on or before December 31, 2004, shall be required to complete all requirements 8 prescribed by the Board and to otherwise comply with the provisions of Chapter 90D, 9 enacted by Section 1 of this act." 10 SECTION 3. Section 10 of S.L. 2002-182 reads as rewritten: "SECTION 10. G.S. 90D-5 and G.S. 90D-6, as enacted in Section 1 of this act, and 11 12 Sections 7, 8, 9, and 10 of this act are effective when the act becomes law. The 13 remainder of the act becomes effective-July 1, 2003. January 1, 2004." 14 **SECTION 4.** Notwithstanding G.S. 150B-21.1(a)(1), the North Carolina 15 Interpreter and Transliterator Licensing Board may adopt temporary rules to implement 16 S.L. 2002-182 until January 1, 2004. 17 **SECTION 5.** Sections 1 through 3 of this act become effective October 31, 18 2002. The remainder of this act is effective when it becomes law.
