A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
AN ACT TO PROHIBIT HUNTING FROM THE RIGHT-OF-WAY IN ROBESON
COUNTY.
The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
SECTION 1. It is unlawful to hunt, take, or kill any wild animal or wild
bird, or to attempt to hunt, take, or kill any wild animal or wild bird, with the use of a
firearm or bow and arrow, from, on, across, or over the roadway or right-of-way of any
public road, street, or highway.
<b>SECTION 2.</b> Violation of the provisions of this act is punishable as a Class
3 misdemeanor. Notwithstanding the provisions of G.S. 15A-1340.23, violation of this
act is punishable by a fine of up to three hundred dollars (\$300.00). A second or
subsequent violation of Section 1 of this act is punishable by a fine of at least three
hundred dollars (\$300.00) and the loss of hunting privileges for a period of 12 months
from the date of the violation.
<b>SECTION 3.</b> This act is enforceable by law enforcement officers of the
Wildlife Resources Commission, by sheriffs and deputy sheriffs, and by other peace
officers with general subject matter jurisdiction.
<b>SECTION 4.</b> This act applies only to Robeson County. This act becomes

effective October 1, 2004, and applies to offenses committed on or after that date.
