- deemed by the personal representative and the claimant to be equitable. The agreement shall be filed in the clerk's office where the letters were granted and shall be a lawful voucher for the personal representative. The same may be impeached in any proceeding against the personal representative for fraud therein.
 - (c) Unless the claim for equitable distribution has been referred as provided in G.S. 28A-19-15, the claimant may at anytime, subject to the provisions of G.S. 28A-19-16, file an action with the district court for distribution of marital or divisible property in accordance with the provisions of G.S. 50-20.
 - (d) A claim for equitable distribution shall constitute a claim of the seventh class under G.S. 28A-19-6."
- **SECTION 4.** This act is effective when it becomes law and applies to actions pending or filed on or after that date.
