A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
AN ACT TO INCREASE THE MAXIMUM FEES THAT THE NORTH CAROLINA
STATE BOARD OF DENTAL EXAMINERS MAY ASSESS AND MAKE
CHANGES TO THE MASSAGE AND BODYWORK THERAPY LAWS.

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

SECTION 1. G.S. 90-39 reads as rewritten:

"§ 90-39. Fees.

In order to provide the means of carrying out and enforcing the provisions of this Article and the duties devolving upon the North Carolina State Board of Dental Examiners, it is authorized to charge and collect fees established by its rules not exceeding the following:

10 **SECTION 2.** G.S. 90-232 reads as rewritten:

11 **"§ 90-232. Fees.**

12 In order to provide the means of carrying out and enforcing the provisions of this
13 Article and the duties devolving upon the North Carolina State Board of Dental
14 Examiners, it is authorized to charge and collect fees established by its rules not
15 exceeding the following:

- 16 (1) Each applicant for examination ~~\$125.00~~ \$350.00
- 17 (2) Each renewal certificate, which fee shall be annually fixed by the Board
18 and not later than November 30 of each year it shall give written notice of
19 the amount of the renewal fee to each dental hygienist licensed to practice

29 In no event may the annual fee imposed on dental hygienists to fund the impaired dental
30 hygienists program exceed the annual fee imposed on dentists to fund the impaired
31 dentist program. All fees shall be payable in advance to the Board and shall be disposed
32 of by the Board in the discharge of its duties under this Article."

33 **SECTION 3.** G.S. 90-626 is amended by adding the following new
34 subdivisions to read:

35 "...

36 (14) Assess civil penalties pursuant to G.S. 90-634.1.

37 (15) Assess the costs of disciplinary actions pursuant to G.S. 90-634.1(d)."

38 **SECTION 4.** Article 36 of Chapter 90 of the General Statutes is amended by
39 adding a new section to read:

40 **"§ 90-634.1. Civil penalties; disciplinary costs.**

41 (a) Authority to Assess Civil Penalties. – The Board may assess a civil penalty
42 not in excess of one thousand dollars (\$1,000) for the violation of any section of this
43 Article or the violation of any rules adopted by the Board. The clear proceeds of any

1 civil penalty assessed under this section shall be remitted to the Civil Penalty and
2 Forfeiture Fund in accordance with G.S. 115C-457.2.

3 (b) Consideration Factors. – Before imposing and assessing a civil penalty, the
4 Board shall consider the following factors:

5 (1) The nature, gravity, and persistence of the particular violation.

6 (2) The appropriateness of the imposition of a civil penalty when
7 considered alone or in combination with other punishment.

8 (3) Whether the violation was willful and malicious.

9 (4) Any other factors that would tend to mitigate or aggravate the
10 violations found to exist.

11 (c) Schedule of Civil Penalties. – The Board shall establish a schedule of civil
12 penalties for violations of this Article and rules adopted by the Board.

13 (d) Costs. – The Board may assess the costs of disciplinary actions against a
14 person found to be in violation of this Article or rules adopted by the Board."

15 **SECTION 5.** Sections 1 and 2 of this act become effective August 1, 2003.
16 Sections 3 and 4 of this act become effective August 1, 2003, and apply to violations
17 occurring on or after that date. The remainder of this act is effective when it becomes
18 law.
