6	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
7	SECTION 1. G.S. 113-145.5 reads as rewritten:
8	"§ 113-145.5. Clean Water Management Trust Fund: Board of Trustees
9	established; membership qualifications; vacancies; meetings and meeting
10	facilities.
11	(a) Board of Trustees Established. – There is established the Clean Water
12	Management Trust Fund Board of Trustees. The Clean Water Management Trust Fund
13	Board of Trustees shall be independent, but for administrative purposes shall be
14	administratively located under within the Department of Environment and Natural
15	Resources. Resources but shall be independent of the Department.
16	(b) Membership. – The Clean Water Management Trust Fund Board of Trustees
17	shall be composed of 18 members. Six members shall be appointed by the Governor, six
